Goodbye, Coach Jansen

Aug. 13 will always be a sad day in Valley City. An entire city laid to rest a sporting legend.

There have been times when I have thought to myself, "Why did I take this job; why did I ever come to Valley City?" Wednesday's funeral reminded me of why. I had the privilege of knowing Bill Jansen.

It struck me just how important this man was to Valley City while looking around at the faces in the crowd. There were people from all walks of life, young and old, all here to pay their last respects. The youth made the biggest impression on me. It looked like another student had died, not a teacher. But Bill was a friend to all of them.

One of the lasting images I will have of this is during the 2002 Track and Field Championships in Grand Forks. While looking through the old Times-Records, I noticed the picture of Christy Johnson calling Bill on a cell phone to tell him about her PR (personal record) in the long jump. That image shows the devotion the team had to their coach.

In the times we live in, it is amazing when students even like their teachers, let alone love and respect them. But this was a different situation. When I was thinking about writing this, I mentioned that fact. The response that I got from the Times-Record publisher Peder Colbenson was perfect. "Bill was sincere," I don't think Bill could be condescending if he wanted to be.

NHSACA NATIONAL AWARDS

The NHSACA National Coaches Convention was hot for North Dakota and for more reasons than being hosted in Tulsa, OK. When North Dakotans arrived in Tulsa, **everyone was prepared for Chipper Farrell and Collette Folstad** being inducted into the National Hall of Fame and for John Hutchison assuming the leadership of the National Association as the 39th President of the National Body. The NHSACA National Coaches Convention was hosted by the Oklahoma Coaches Association with a similar format that Nebraska used in 2000. Oklahoma scheduled its state's activities and coaches' clinics and invited all NHSACA registrants to attend all of the Oklahoma sessions. North Dakota was proud to have a solid contingent in attendance. Past President Dave Dougherty and President Randy Johnson extended personal tributes to the award winners at the convention.

Chipper and Collette were inducted into the NHSACA Hall of Fame at a luncheon function on Wednesday noon. Chipper's years of service to NDHSCA as *Dakota Coach* editor, his state championship teams that he had coached, his State Coach of the Year Awards, and his National Coach of the Year Award were astounding as his credits were read at the ceremony.

Collette's years of service, her state championship teams that she had coached, her State Coach of the Year Awards, and her pioneering as a female coach in a male structure were incredible as she was recognized during the ceremony.

MINUTES

President Jack Carlson called the Annual Meeting of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association to order with 79 coaches present.

Brian Flyberg moved to accept the minutes of the 2002 NDHSCA Annual Meeting as printed; Dan Imdieke seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Gelaine Orvik gave a financial report of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association:

The Financial Report includes the payment of the Executive Secretary in full for the year of 2002-2003. This is the first time NDHSCA has been current in the payment of the Executive Secretary at the end of the fiscal year. No 2003 Convention Income is recorded for the report. Bob Zimney moved to accept the financial report; Rick Anderson seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Gelaine Orvik gave a report on the *Dakota Coach*. The Association will again publish four issues in the coming fiscal year: August first, December first, April first, and June 15th. Gelaine explained the professional nature of the publication is due to the work of Joyce Holter, who edits and prepares each issue for publication. Gelaine also solicited members for "newsy" articles and suggestions for the *Dakota Coach* material. Although the present arrangement seems successful, the publication is still in the hands of Association Coaches who provide news suggestions.

Terry West gave a membership report for Karen Hardie; the Association had 880 paid members in 2003 and presently have 297 registered for the 2003 Convention. Curt Herman moved to accept the membership report; Rich Hovland seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Randy Johnson introduced the Vice President candidates: Scott Grochow from Rugby High School and Julie Jensen from Kindred High School. Randy announced the balloting would take place at the end of the 1:00 PM session on Thursday.

John Hutchison gave a report on the 2003 NHSACA Convention that will be held the week of July 27th-July 31st. **North Dakota has eleven Coach of the Year Finalists and two NHSACA Hall of Fame Inductees. John will also become the President of the Association.**

Terry West gave a report on the Lions' All Star Basketball. He reviewed the past summer's games and also announced that Curt Herman's resignation as co-chairman of Lion's All Star Basketball will become effective August 1st, 2003. Terry requested interested people to contact a member of the NDHSCA Executive Board for consideration.

Scott Toenies gave a report of the Optimists' All Star Volleyball competition. He explained complications he had encountered and assured the Association that the next year will be without impediments.

Mike Berg's report on the Shrine Football was given by Gelaine Orvik. The games were played at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks with no complications or serious injuries. Mike has been complimentary to the Association's football coaches in their being more direct in telling players their responsibilities and necessity to adhere to All Star Guidelines.

Gelaine Orvik explained the details of the Longevity Awards and explained that the Association is now up-to-date with presentations over a five year period. In the future only five year interval presentations will occur.

Terry West gave his report on the findings of the *Ad Hoc* Committee for Season Change. He invited coaches' comments as another meeting will be held in April to affect change after the two year introduction to change.

Randy Johnson gave a report on the action of the Sportsmanship Committee. He explained the final draft will appear on the NDHSAA Website. The final draft has been returned to the NNDHSAA Board of Directors. The concept of the committee is for each school to submit a plan to enhance Sportsmanship at the Member School's Activities. Then the schools are eligible for Sportsmanship Banners or a patch for the banner at the State Tournament. If a school has not submitted a plan, the school will not be eligible for a banner or patch.

Gelaine Orvik gave a convention report; 297 people have registered and every effort is being made to make the sessions meaningful. Every attempt has been made to make the sessions convenient for every sport. Exhibitors and attendees have been very complimentary.

The NDHSCA Executive Board is dealing with plans for the 2004 convention. The date has been established to be July 27th-July 31st. The site will be either Bismarck or Fargo; details will be completed in August.

The term friend is sometimes thrown around indicating everyone we have a speaking relationship with. But very few of those people are really friends. Bill was the type of person you made you feel like his friend even after only a few conversations. That was one of his many gifts.

I think it is interesting that while we were mourning the death of a local sports hero, the nation was going through the same thing with the death of hockey coach Herb Brooks. I read a lot of things written about Brooks' life over the last few days and they all said how much Brooks inspired his athletes on and off the ice, how he was a master motivator and he was a good friend. To me, you could replace Bill's name with Brooks' and insert "track and field/cross country" each time you had "hockey" and it would be hard to tell them apart.

While it is tough to take when a person that offers so much passes, I think that we were lucky to have as many years as we did. He gave more in his 65 years than many would give in three lifetimes. To steal a line from the eulogy, I am envious of you who had more time than me."

In the Gospel reading, the quote "run the good race" was used. Bill not only ran the good race, he set PR's that will never be broken.

From the staff of the T-R, thank you, Bill, for all that you gave to Valley City. Goodbye, friend.

Jack Carlson called the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Executive Board Meeting to order with seven members present.

President Carlson asked for approval of the March 2003 meeting minutes. Randy Johnson moved to accept the minutes as printed in the spring issue of the *Dakota Coach* and printed for the executive board; Todd Olson seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0.

Gelaine Orvik provided the executive board an oral explanation of the financial report, which included an explanation of the profit for the year and an explanation of the cash on hand as of

Dave Dougherty gave a report of communication he had received since March. An exhibitor had contacted him regarding a vending position. He had

also received communication regarding All Star competitors.

Jack Carlson reported no communications. Randy Johnson reported no communications. Dave Dougherty reported no communications. Todd Olson reviewed a letter received from Nancy Lium regarding the lack of funds to perpetuate the Tom Lium Memorial Scholarship. He reviewed conversations with South High School Basketball staff that will make efforts to be responsible for the scholarship.

John Hutchison gave a report on the Coach of the Year balloting. He indicated that Class B Baseball does not carry on the selection process very well.

Terry West reviewed the Lions Basketball Chair resignation. He relented and agreed to stay on for one year to complete the Basketball Chair continuity. President Jack Carlson and Gelaine Orvik will arrange a meeting with Curt Herman and determine his plans. Financial arrangements will be in the hands of the President and Gelaine Orvik. President Carlson called an Executive Board meeting for Tuesday at 4:30 PM to discuss the results of the meeting with Curt Herman.

Randy Johnson moved to increase the amount each Lions All Star Basketball Player raises to \$250.00 and the Lions' percentage to the North Dakota High School Coaches Association be increased to 20%; Todd Olson seconded the motion. Motion passed 7-0.

Dave Dougherty moved to increase the compensation to the Lions' All Star Chair be increased to no more than \$1500.00, and the Assistant Chair be compensated \$500.00; motion seconded by Randy Johnson. The motion and the second were withdrawn.

Dave Dougherty moved that \$2000.00 be used to compensate the Lions' All Star Chairs and that the job be divided by two people; motion seconded by Randy Johnson. Motion passed 7-0.

The NHSACA National Coach of the Year Nominees were reviewed. The finalists have been contacted and seven have registered for the convention.

The Optimists do the paper work and mailings for the sponsor details.

Terry West gave a report on the Lions All Star Basketball competition. He shared ideas for progress for the Lions' All Star Basketball Chairmanship. The board shared names of people who have submitted their names for consideration for the Chairmanship. Randy moved that Terry and Gelaine interview candidates in the order of consideration and provide the NDHSCA Executive Board with a recommendation for a co-chairman to work with Terry West; Todd Olson seconded the motion. Motion passed with 5-0 vote.

Gelaine Orvik reviewed the status of VALIC. The VALIC personnel contacted Gelaine in May and confirmed that they would continue to pay for the Hall of Fame plaques.

Gelaine reviewed the status of Burger King and commended John Walsh for the continued support from Burger King by way of the checks for the Scholarship Recipients and the \$1500.00 support for the Association.

Gelaine reviewed the status of Select Inn. NDHSCA has not received the financial support from Select Inn over the past two years. In Gelaine's conversation with Select Inn personnel, they are in a state of being sold to Premier Housing and have promised to fulfill their responsibility for payments in the arrears; they will also confirm their 2003-2004 commitment in September.

Community First National Bank has committed to support for the long run. Gelaine will provide them with an invoice for payment. Terry West moved to pay the entire cost of Hall of Fame Rings of new Hall of Fame recipients; motion seconded by Gelaine. Motion passed 6-0.

The NDHSAA Advisory Committees were reviewed with replacements selected from interested applicants, geographical location, Class A and B equality, and other considerations.

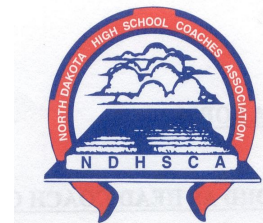

Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year.

Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

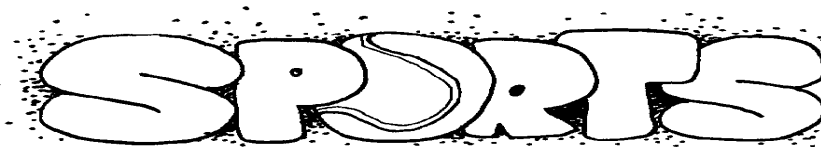

On Thursday evening, the North Dakota delegation witnessed another moment of inspiration as **John Hutchison** received the NHSACA Gavel from President Bruce Williams to begin his tenure as NHSACA President. John's inauguration was witnessed by his wife, Lonny; NDHSCA Executive Board Members, the NHSACA National Coach of the Year Finalists and their spouses; the NHSACA Hall of Fame Inductees and their spouses; NDHSCA Executive Secretary, Gelaine Orvik and his wife, Linda.

John accepted the leadership of the organization and challenged the members in attendance to lead by example. He stated his goal as President was to add additional dual states members to the National Association.
