2003 CONVENTION PLANS

Although the dates, sites, and activities for the 2003 NDHSCA Coaches Convention have been established, the most important details—the speakers—are yet to be finalized. The 28th Annual NDHSCA Coaches Convention will be held at Fargo South High School, July 22, 23, 24, and 25. The seminar sessions will be held on Tuesday July 22nd and the sports' specific clinic sessions will be held on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Special events are planned for each day. On Wednesday, the annual golf scramble will be held in the afternoon and followed by a mixer. On Thursday, the NDHSCA Annual Meeting will be held in the morning, followed by a motivational speaker. On Thursday night, the annual NDHSCA Hall of Fame and Coach of the Year Awards Banquet will be held at the Ramada Plaza Suites. Friday's activities will close out the convention.

Special attractions for this clinic sessions will be to invite retired coaches to speak. We have identified some special people for each sport to add their special thoughts on coaching. A complete schedule of speakers and clinic details will be prepared for the summer issue of the *Dakota Coach*.

The National High School Athletic Coaches Association Convention will be held at Tulsa, OK on Sunday, July 27 through Friday, August 1. You will find the registration form for the National Convention on the Internet. (See page 16)

North Dakota's John Hutchison will assume the Presidency of the NHSACA at the National Convention. North Dakota is proud of John's role, and the NDHSCA Executive Board urges every coach to make the effort to support John.

NDHSCA Scholarship Recipients

The NDHSCA Executive Board selected the recipients for the NDHSCA Scholarships at its March 30th meeting. **Carolyn Becker, Beulah HS**, who plans to attend Northern State University (Aberdeen, SD); **Micaela Kruckenberg, Fargo South HS**, who will attend University of Minnesota or North Dakota State University; and **Craig Nelson, May/Port-C/G HS**, whose college plans are undecided will each receive a \$500.00 scholarship from NDHSCA and Burger King. Dan Fawcett from Sargent Central High School is also a part of the Battalion. They both expect to return within a year.

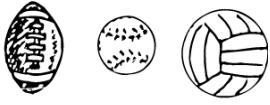
I am sure that other North Dakota Coaches are also involved in Freedom Iraq. Please inform the Association Office of any news of this matter.

Coaches and Parents

There is probably not a high school coach in the state who has not dealt with parental "input" during his or her coaching career. Many respected coaches have been forced out for various reasons, such as not playing the right kids or not winning enough games. Mick Hoglund, head boys basketball coach at Dell Rapids, (South Dakota) has had his share of problems with parents, but he took matters into his own hands and wrote the following letter to his hometown newspaper:

"My parents were really old-fashioned. They showed me the value of school and what it had to offer. They let me fight my own battles. They never put anyone down; I fought for what I achieved.

"I was responsible for being part of the team, following all the rules and doing the right thing. If I didn't, I had to answer to my parents, teacher and coach. The teacher was always right, the coach was always right, and my teammates needed me. Simple rules, if I was smart enough to make the grade or good enough to make the team, I did it without my parents. As an adult, I still follow the rules my coaches and parents set for me. I respect them. I still make mistakes, but I don't blame others.

"I estimate that through middle school, high school, college and graduate school I had 18 different coaches and over 65 teachers. I adjusted to different styles and personalities and learned from each of them. However, here is how to get things done in Dell Rapids: If my child's performance is not what I had planned, someone is going to pay.

"You know who you are. Here are some points to ponder for these people:

- How long do you plan on doing this for your child? Will trying to fire 18 coaches and 65 teachers get you what you want?
- What kind of message are you giving your child? Blame others for your actions?
- What is going to happen when you're not around? They will blame you when you are not there to bail them out.
- You will be surrounded by people you don't even like. Think about it. Look around and watch your back. You are next.

"You are the beginning of the end of your child's success. Wake up! I have put myself up for a great deal of scrutiny in writing this. However, it seems that we teachers and coaches in Dell Rapids are already fair game for public bashing. Get your facts straight. Don't say things that aren't true. I thought I might as well tell it like it is. Come to think of it, I could tell you some amazing stories. Hundreds of silent parents who are doing the right things are getting a bad reputation. That is a fact.

"A few will read this and come up with an excuse and write a rebuttal, but deep down you all know that I am right. Maybe I am old-fashioned, but I will follow my father and mother's examples. History has proven that your children will follow yours. Do your job. Let teachers and coaches do theirs."

Hoglund deserves an A-plus for his comments, which need to be taken to heart by many parents and fans. You could substitute "Dell Rapids" for nearly any other school in the state.

Why don't we let the coaches coach, the parents parent and the fans be fans!

Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year.

Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

- Only meets in which three or more schools participate will count as an invitational.
- Schools can still have a dual meet record that would remain the same along with record for the invitationals they attend.
- It will be up to the individual coaches to determine their records from past years and update wins or revise their victory milestone forms.

Winning % equals $22/33 = 67\%$ 5 meets x .67=3.35
 Losing % equals $11/33 = 33\%$ 5 meets x .33 = 1.65
 Your record for the season would be 3 wins and 2 losses for invitationals.

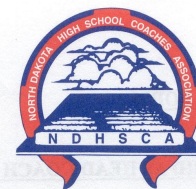

At 8:03 AM, President Jack Carlson called the meeting of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association to order with all members present.

Terry West gave a report on Lions' Basketball. The games will be played at the Bismarck Civic Center on July 15th and at West Fargo High School on July 16th.

Class A Boys' team and Girls' team have been selected. The Class A Girls' coaches, Greg Amundson of Mandan High School and Anne Watkins of Fargo North High School, have agreed to their coaching assignments. None of the Class A girls' players has conflict with volleyball. The Class A Boys' coaches, Dean Winczewski of Dickinson High School and Mark Slotsve of Williston High School, have given their tentative acceptance to their coaching assignments. None of the Class A boys' players has conflict with football.

Terry asked for suggestions on the media release of players' names. Suggestion was shared for the boys' and girls' teams be released on separate dates. Terry also gave a report for Curt. The Class B team selection phone calls will be made on Wednesday, April 2nd. The player guidelines will contain a statement that any school suspension will serve as an automatic suspension from All Star Competition also.

Scott Toenies gave his report on the Optimists All Star Volleyball Match. The players have been selected and the player materials have been returned. John Hutchison reviewed the NHSACA National Convention schedule and attendance by the North Dakota delegation. The NHSACA National Hall of Fame Induction ceremony will be held on Wednesday, July 30th, at a noon luncheon. The NHSACA National Awards Banquet will be held on Thursday, July 31st, in the evening. North Dakota will hold a social on Wednesday evening, July 30th, at the Hilton. This is to honor John Hutchison as he receives the NHSACA gavel to lead the Association through the 2003-2004 school year.

Randy Johnson distributed copies of the *Final Report Sportsmanship Ad Hoc Committee* that also can be found on the NDHSAA Website home office page. The NDHSAA Board of Directors is in the process of studying the document. The Board also has asked specific groups to evaluate parts of the document. The *Ad Hoc* committee is scheduled to meet again on April 17th.

The Executive Board also discussed the role and responsibility of committee members. The bottom line for the Executive Board is that the committee members who represent the NDHSCA must be willing to "practice what we preach," to "talk the talk **and** walk the walk," and promote the philosophy and background of sportsmanship. Randy Johnson moved to accept a general guideline for all coach of the year selections, NDHSCA recognition, and other sport activities: "Each scoring team will be allowed one ballot for sport activity or athlete recognition. When voting for Coach of the Year, each coach (body) has one vote—exception is that co-coaches have only one vote."

Gelaine Orvik gave an update on the 2003 Coaches Convention. We will make a concerted effort to involve retired coaches to speak on topics of their choice. We will use high school coaches and Division II college coaches for the majority of the speaking assignments.

Seminars will be held on Tuesday, July 22nd; the topics will be "Speed, Strength, and Conditioning"; "Professionalism"; and "Sportsmanship."

The board discussed the necessity of developing a mentoring program and the willingness to participate in assisting the young coach.

Gelaine reviewed the registration form and costs. The Executive Board recognized the necessity to make the cost for the entire convention more equitable for all attending. The charge will also make

the registration more understandable.

Terry West moved to increase the NDHSCA membership fee to \$50.00; motion seconded by Randy Johnson. Motion passed 7-0.

Gelaine was reminded to have binder/folders for the convention.

The next NDHSCA Executive Board will meet at Fargo South High School on Monday, July 21st at Noon, in the Office Conference Room.

Terry West moved to adjourn the meeting; President Carlson declared the meeting adjourned.

NDHSCA Victory Milestones



Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year.

Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

- Schools can still have a dual meet record that would remain the same along with a record for the invitationals they attend.
- It will be up to the individual coaches to determine their records from past years and update wins or revise their victory milestone forms.
