2005 NDHSCA CONVENTION REVIEW

The 2005 NDHSCA Convention was successfully held at the Mandan Seven Seas Convention Center during the last week of July and was a huge success. Some items were more impressive than others.

Probably the most successful aspect of the convention was the 25 golf coaches in attendance at the golf sessions that were held at Hawktree Golf Course. Chuck Ruppert was very kind to orchestrate the activities at the course site, but Chipper Farrell needs a significant "attaboy" for his communication and arrangements for NDHSCA. Jim Craven was outstanding and has confirmed his attendance and topics for next summer, already.

Secondly, the tennis coaches have asked repeatedly to be included. All indications are that tennis has returned, to stay on the schedule. Sixteen tennis coaches attended the sessions, and all were

adamant about their taking the schedule break to attend the NDHSCA Annual Meeting on Thursday morning.

Although the numbers attending the volleyball sessions do not match the attendance from last year, the presentations were incomparable. The volleyball coaches appear to have concluded that at least one day needs to be presented "oncourt."

Several coaches confided that this year's sport-specific sessions were probably the best ever. "Obviously, some individual speakers in the past have been more outstanding, but the overall presentation and expertise for the entire convention supercedes all other years" was a repeated statement from several coaches from different sports.

Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year. Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a



coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

NDSU/UND TICKET POLICY FOR NDHSCA

For many NDHSCA Members, this will not be a marked change from past arrangements for athletic admission with the two major North Dakota universities. However, some changes have been implemented and NDHSCA Members have the responsibility to adhere to the arrangements.

First, every NDHSCA Member has the responsibility to produce his or her membership card and a photo identification when accepting the reserved tickets at the Ticket Box Office at the respective universities. Each University has the authority to confiscate any membership card if it has been transferred or is being used by anyone other than the member. Neither the universities nor NDHSCA makes any guarantees as to the quality of the complimentary admission.

Secondly, each university will have the complimentary ticket available for attaining at least 24 hours before game time. Tickets may be obtained at the respective Box Offices.

The University of North Dakota and North Dakota State University will expect NDHSCA Members to contact the NDHSCA Executive Secretary by telephone or email before noon on the DAY PRIOR to each contest to request respective tickets. The Executive Secretary will accumulate all requests and convey those requests to the respective university within 24 hours of the contest.

The University of North Dakota will require this arrangement for **ALL** athletic contests. North Dakota State University will require this arrangement only for football contests. For other NDSU contests, working personnel will accept a membership card and photo identification as admission at the admission gates.

Please adhere to these guidelines for UND and NDSU beginning with the September 17th contests. Admission guidelines for other North Dakota Colleges and Universities remain the same as in the past.

tickets.
