NDHSCA COACHES CONVENTION PLANNING

The 2005 NDHSCA Coaches Convention is in full planning status. Convention activities will be held at the Mandan Seven Seas Convention Center, with a few sessions held at Mandan High School, beginning with the seminar sessions on Tuesday, July 26th. The sport specific sessions continue on Wednesday through Friday, the 27th-29th.

The Awards banquet will be held on Thursday, July 28th. Basketball, football, track & field, golf, tennis, soccer, wrestling, and volleyball will hold advisory committee meetings during the course of the activities.

All coaches are urged to attend these sessions to review the new guidelines and begin planning for the 2005-2006 Advisory Committee recommendations.

Rules interpretations meetings will be conducted for football, golf, soccer, swimming, volleyball, and wrestling. The rules meetings will be scheduled with the least conflict with other sports possible.

Three seminars will be held on Tuesday: Coaches and Conflict, Special Topics, and Speed, Strength & Conditioning. These seminars will involve outstanding speakers. Sherm Sylling will

conduct a session on "NDHSAA Eligibility Rules" that have had some coaches requesting explanations. Bill Cahill will center his presentation on Drug Awareness Program and the Jamestown HS Student Awareness Program.

Linda Lee, Family Violence Prevention Fund, will present a session on the role of coaches to end violence to others. Presentation will be made on steroids and the need for steroid education.

the daughter of Brian and Rhea Flyberg. Whitney has a 4.0 Grade Point Average (GPA), ranks




first in a class of 23 and

Jerry Popp Inducted Into NFHS Hall of Fame

Jerry Popp, former cross-country, track and speech coach from Bowman High School is one of 13 individuals selected for induction into the 2005 class of the National High School Hall of Fame. The induction will take place on July 2 in conjunction with the National Federation of High School Associations summer conference to be held in San Antonio, Texas.

Success as a high school cross country coach will always be measured against the standards of Jerry Popp. In 29 years as girls and boys cross country coach at Bowman (North Dakota) High School, Popp set marks that may never be touched.

From 1975 until his retirement in 2003, Popp's girls cross country teams won the NDHSAA state champion-

ship an amazing 23 times, which stands as the national record in the National High School Sports Record Book published by the NFHS. The Bowman girls were runners-up two other times, which means Popp's squads placed either first or second 25 of his 29 years.

Popp also started the speech program at Bowman High School in 1975 and, amazingly, he coached his speech teams to 23 regional championships and 19 state titles, and he had 55 individual state champions.

Among his many honors, Popp was named NFHS National Boys Cross Country Coach of the Year in 2002 and was inducted into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association (NHSACA) Hall of Fame in 2001. He was NHSACA National Girls Cross Country Coach of the Year in 1993, and was inducted into the North Dakota High School Coaches Hall of Fame in 1999.

Popp retired following the 2003 season and moved to Minnesota to be closer to family. He currently teaches in the Willmar, Minnesota, schools. He can be reached by email (a) the following:
