2007 NDHSCA Special Recognition Awards

The 2007 NDHSCA Special Recognition Award recipients were selected by the NDHSCA Executive Committee with the awards to be presented at the Annual 2007 NDHSCA Coach of the Year and Hall of Fame Banquet. The recipients were **Darin Erstad** and **Travis Hafner.**

Both Erstad and Hafner were selected because of the demeanor they project of North Dakota athletes who have been extremely successful and continue to credit their hometown high school athletics and coaches for success.

Darin Erstad is a 1992 graduate of Jamestown High School. He was a three sport athlete at Jamestown HS and played legion baseball in the summer. He was a key to the Bluejay's athletic team success in his senior year as a member of their football, hockey, and track and field teams. He was named North Dakota High School Athlete of the Year by North Dakota Associated Press Sportswriters and Sportscasters. Erstad attended the University of Nebraska and played football and baseball for the Cornhuskers. He was First Team All-American and Big Eight Co-Player of the Year in 1995, his junior year. Darin was a punter/kicker for the 1994 National Champion Nebraska Cornhuskers Football team. He was an Academic All-Big Eight recipient in 1993 and 1995 in baseball and in 1994 in football.

Darin was named Cape Cod League Most Valuable Player in 1994 and was the first player selected by the California Angels in the 1995 MLB amateur draft. He was an American League All Star selection in 1998 and 2000. In 2000, he set the Angels' team record with 240 hits and a .355 batting average, as well as winning the Silver Slugger Award.

Erstad was a member of the 2002 World Series Champion California Angels.

CCE and NDHSCA Form Pact

Coca-Cola Powerade and NDHSCA formed an agreement that allows NDHSCA to name the NDHSCA Outstanding Senior Athlete to be the *North Dakota High School Coaches Association Powerade Outstanding Senior Athlete Award*.

Randy Johnson and David Michaelson represented NDHSCA to develop the agreement. T.J. Herauf, Dickinson Coca-Cola Bottling Company, and Todd Wegenast, Midwest Coca-Cola, represented Coca-Cola Powerade in the negotiation. The final agreement was consummated in September, just in time for the 2007 Fall Sports.

A significant deviation from Outstanding

Senior Athlete Awards at the state championship for each sport will be the addition of a plaque to be presented to the athlete's school. NDHSCA will make requests that each school make effort to display the plaques in a visible, high-traffic area in the school building.

The Agreement provides finances for NDHSCA to continue with the Outstanding Senior Athlete Award presentations in 37 sports today, with possibly as many as two additional sports in a short time. Coca-Cola Powerade receives naming rights to be attached to the award as well as significant exposure in the award presentation process.

2007 NDHSCA Convention Review

The 2007 NDHSCA Coaches Convention was a success, again. Although the number of 328 coaches registered is important, the superseding indicator of success is always the reactions from the registrants. More important than the number of coaches who register is the number of coaches who register for college credits; 59 coaches registered for two-credits and 40 coaches registered for one credit.

Dr. Denis Isrow has shared that so many positive evaluations have been returned. He compliments the presenter/ coach and student/coach for the quality presentation and reception.

Highlights from the sessions include quality on-court and on-the-mat presentations. A special thank you is extended to Lorell Jungling and his staff as they prepared for last minute presentations. Volleyball continues to hold extraordinary on-court sessions that appeal to larger and larger numbers each year.

North Dakota coaches owe Chipper Farrell a special thank you as he stepped in to find presenters when Jim Craven's air travel costs were prohibitive and caused his cancellation of presentations. Whenever North Dakota Coaches wonder about our cohorts, feel very confident that our coaches will always be very competent in times of turmoil, and they will step up and deliver.

Tim Flannery, National Federation, made a presentation to athletic directors on a special topic, "Coaching Fundamentals." The response by athletic directors was phenomenal. Several people have indicated the presentation would invaluable for first and second year coaches. For that reaction, NHDSCA Executive Committee will entertain a presentation by Mr. Flannery at a November Executive Committee Meeting regarding making "Coaching Fundamentals" a part of the Tuesday seminar session in 2008.

From the Executive Secretary's Desk

First of all, my apology is sent for my truancy in the editing the *Dakota Coach*. Each time I was prepared to finish the details for editing, I was called to another fire that needed extinguishing (figuratively, of course). I am sorry.

So much has happened since the Convention in Mandan. I hope that I can touch on the most significant developments!

On August 26th, John and Lonny Hutchison and the rest of Northwood experienced a tornado. John and Lonny were fortunate in that their new home received minimal damage. However, their house of 20 some years was damaged appreciably. The community was mortal injuries---except for one---and had fewer serious, critical injuries than expected. The city however had millions of dollars in damage, including nearly total destruction of the school. But as usual, North Dakotans stepped up and assisted in more ways than one can identify---including universities and high schools sending entire teams and organizations to assist in cleanup. Collections were held at many public occasions to assist with community needs. One coach even made arrangement for shoes to be donated to the team. The teams and coaches in Northwood-Hatton have been highly successful in spite of all of the complications.

Early in August Randy Johnson informed me that LeLand Opp suffered a heart attack while shingling his roof. He was rushed to Bismarck hospital and had major surgery.After about a week of critical condition, LeLand was shortly thereafter improved and returned home. Of course, you know that LeLand wanted only to be back teaching fulltime and coaching, but, for the most part, adhered to his doctor's orders and returned to work slowly.

Congratulations to Dave Handt and the Litchville-Marion-Montpelier HS Girls' Basketball team! The details of their accomplishments, through his essay, are accounted in *Dakota Coach*.

Thank you Randy Johnson for vour leadership over the past year. You have superlative in your assistance and your administration. Also, Randy and David Michaelson have been invaluable in their arrangement of the agreement with Coca Cola Enterprises and Powerade. NDHSCA will from this time forward refer to the Senior Athlete of the Year Award as the NDHSCA Powerade Senior Athlete of the Year Award. A plaque is presented at the State competition to the recipient, and a second plaque will be mailed to the coach for display at the school.

In July, Tim Flannery from National Federation, presented the course on Coaching Fundamentals to the Athletic Administrators. It was very well-received. Many administrators have already moved forward to declare the 3-5 hour session to be presented to all coaches, and some schools will begin with first and second year coaches. Tim will make a presentation at the November NDHSCA Executive Committee Meeting, in hope that NDHSCA will provide the Coaching Fundamentals at the Summer Convention.

John Walsh and Bisking II, Inc. are providing the NDHSCA Scholarships, again. NDHSCA and John are committed to award at least three \$500 Scholarships to sons and/or daughters of NDHSCA members each year. Since the involvement of John, we have presented four scholarships each year. We are especially




proud of scholarships recipients as they contact NDHSCA at graduation.

Dave Handt Receives EAS Award

Dave Handt, Litchville-Marion-Montpelier High School girls' basketball coach, wrote one of the eight regional winning essays. Dave's essay identified a time that his team "...called on all the energy and team chemistry to create a season defining moment." His team overcame a 13 point deficit and "...came back to force overtime and proceeded to win by seven."

Dave said that his team "...believed this was accomplished largely through our programs which included strict eligibility, team conditioning, curfews, dietary planning, and pre-game meals."

Handt points to the "joint effort of parents, school cooks, and team members that largely contributed to this defining moment. Together, they developed and organized a system of watching dietary habits and pre-game meals which has increased energy levels and hydration situations. It also brought all groups together and a very positive chemistry exists in the communities."

Dave Handt was unable to attend the NHSACA National Annual Meeting in Milwaukee, but his North Dakota Coaches were very proud of the school's accomplishments. John Hutchison, NDHSCA Assistant Executive Secretary, stood in for Dave and Litchville-Marion-Montpelier High School to receive the award.

Special Recognition Awards - Erstad & Hafner

Darin was a Gold Glove Award winner in 2000, 2002 and 2004. He is the only player in MLB history to win a Gold Glove Award both as an outfielder and as an infielder. He was recipient of the Roberto Clemente Award in 2005 for his efforts in Southern California community activities. He became a member of the Chicago White Sox before the 2007 season. Darin is married to Jessica and they have a daughter, Jordan Elizabeth.

Travis Hafner is a graduate of Sykeston High School (1995). Travis was a two sport athlete at Sykeston HS, participating in basketball where he was a two-time all district player and received all-region honors his senior season, and track and field where he was a state track participant in 1995 and 1996. Travis played his Legion baseball with Fessenden and Carrington.

Travis attended Cowley Community College in Arkansas City, Kansas, where his MVP performance led Cowley College to the National Junior College World Series Championship in 1997.

Travis was drafted by the Texas Rangers and broke into the major leagues in 2002. He was traded to the Cleveland Indians in 2003 and has been a fixture at designated hitter in the Indians lineup. At the time of this publication Travis is playing in the ALCS vs. the Boston Red Sox.

Travis is married to Amy (Beekman) and resides in Cleveland, Ohio. Travis is very active in the community of Cleveland and is involved in many charitable organizations which benefit the youth of the Cleveland area.

Because Travis and Darin play major league baseball, their awards were not presented at the summer banquet. Arrangements will be made to present the awards during the off-season, hopefully at a high school function.

2007-2008 NDHSCA All Star Player Guidelines

These guidelines are reminders for North Dakota football, basketball and volleyball coaches. Please share these with any athlete who may be a potential All Star Player in 2008. All Star Guidelines are in effect from the first day of fall sports and apply until the completion of the All Star contests.

- Written authorization from the player's parents or guardians must be submitted with the player's acceptance to participate in training exercises and the games.
- 2. All players must bring their high school physical card, a copy of the physical card, or a letter from their doctor and present it to the All Star contest officials when they report to their training sites the first day, in order to practice with the team.
- 3. The players must have graduated from high school before June 15 of the current school year.
- The players <u>may be attending an activity class</u> <u>but must not be enrolled as a full-time student</u> <u>at a JC, College or University</u> (Acceptance by a college, but not enrolled as a full-time student).
- 5. Players must reside within the state of North Dakota or meet the residence requirements of the NDHSAA.
- 6. All players must pay their own transportation costs to and from camp.
- 7. All practice equipment must be furnished by the players.
- 8. Players are required to stay in the housing provided by the sponsors.
- 9. Players are required to attend all events scheduled by the sponsors.
- 10. Players must arrange through the coaches for any free time.
- 11. Players' vehicles <u>MAY NOT BE USED</u> while in training camp.

ND Convention Dates Tuesday, July 29 through Friday, August 1 2008

- 12. Players <u>MUST</u> be at <u>ALL</u> scheduled practices to be considered a playing member of the All Star team and are not allowed to participate in other organized athletic events during the training period. This includes being present at check-in at the beginning of the All Star event. If an issue arises that requires a player to miss practice due to some immediate family problem, the player must clarify the reason with the All Star chairperson prior to the start of the All Star event. <u>FAILURE TO SO COULD RESULT IN DISMISSAL FROM THE ALL STAR TEAM. PLAYERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO LEAVE TO PLAY LEGION BASEBALL AT ANY <u>TIME.</u></u>
- 13. The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or controlled substances is forbidden. Any player using or possessing these items at any time from the <u>BEGIN-NING OF THE FIRST ALLOWABLE PRACTICE FOR FALL SPORTS, SET UP BY THE NDHSAA, UNTIL THE COMPLETION OF THE ALL STAR GAMES, WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE AND WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION. Players <u>MUST ADHERE</u> to the spirit and letter of these rules.</u>
- 14. All players shall be in their rooms and lights will be out by 11:00 p.m. at the latest, except game-nights.
- 15. Dorm or housing rules shall be strictly enforced.
- 16. Only All Stars shall be permitted in the All Star rooms; visitors, parents, and friends are met in the lobby.
- 17. College coaches, high school coaches, and friends not connected with the actual coaching or supervision of the All Star team shall be permitted to contact any player ONLY WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE ALL STAR COACHES!
- 18. Any action/behavior, by the player, which the All Star Chairman or All Star Committee considers as an inappropriate representation of an All Star player will be grounds for immediate dismissal from the team.
- 19. Any player who has been suspended from high school or from an athletic team by respective high schools will be dismissed from the All Star team.

NDHSCA Victory Milestones



Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year. Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball



record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

- It will be up to the individual coaches to determine their records from past years and update wins or revise their victory milestone forms.
