


## From Executive Secretary's Desk

In one case, parents are disenchanted with the coach because of lack of success and exposure for their student/athlete. In a second case, the school's administration has chosen to deal with one coach's ineffectiveness and inability by applying the same blanket reprimand to all coaches in the school. In the third incident, a coach has had to deal with coaching a faculty member's son and the reverberations from those difficulties.

We as coaches need to support our fraternal brothers and sisters in any way we can. We need to be willing to standup and be supportive by verbalizing our recognition of our cohort's strengths and contributions. We need to be willing to write letters of endorsement to support other members of our fraternity. We need to be willing to challenge those who harm our brothers and sisters without reason.

At this summer's Coaches Convention, I will suggest to have our Association provide liability insurance for all active member coaches to further protect them from false indictments and allega-

tions as we practice our profession. We need to feel more comfortable in our profession when we have fingers pointed at us unfairly and without warrant.

We need to take time to extend a special congratulatory message to four outstanding coaches from one school who are retiring after this school year. Gene Manson, boys' basketball; Bruce Anderson, girls' basketball; Jerry Lvon, boys' and girls' tennis; and Ken Disher, boys' swimming and diving; have resigned as head coaches at Minot High School. These four greats have contributed to greatness at Minot High School. Disher and Lyon have been National Coach of the Year as well as state coach of the year numerous times. Manson and Anderson have both been state coach of the year several times as well as NHSACA Coach of the Year Finalists on several occasions. Manson, Lyon and Disher have been inducted into the NDHSCA Hall of Fame. Manson

### **NDHSCA Victory Milestones**

Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory

milestones for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year. Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both JHS boys basketball and varsity basketball, the coach counts only the varsity basketball record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Awards will be sent upon request after records are updated.

#### Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- 1. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- 2. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- 3. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- 4. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)





### NDHSCA All Star Player Guidelines - continued from page 1

About ten years ago, the 13<sup>th</sup> Guideline was expanded and a 19<sup>th</sup> Guideline was added to cover some incidents where a school had rules that were more stringent than the NDHSAA Competition rules. The NDHSCA philosophy was that the Association would certainly never try to circumvent dismissal or suspension of an athlete by an athlete as less important or any different than dismissal or suspension because of NDHSAA Competition rules.

Therefore "All Star Guideline" number 13 had two additional sentences were added: "Any player using or possessing these items at any time from the BEGINNING OF THE FIRST ALLOWABLE PRACTICE FOR FALL SPORTS, SET UP BY THE NDHSAA, UNTIL THE COMPLETION OF THE ALL STAR GAMES, WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PAR-

TICIPATE AND WILL NOT BE
CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION. Players MUST ADHERE
to the spirit and letter of these rules."

Secondly, a 19<sup>th</sup> Guideline was added: "Any player who has been suspended from high school or from an athletic team by respective high schools will be dismissed from the All Star team." Both changes were made to clarify some situations that may have been unclear and to maintain the same credibility for student-athletes who may have been suspended for reasons that are not covered by the NDHSAA rules.

As long as there are rules, violations will occur. As long as violations occur, NDHSCA will enforce the violations as clearly, evenly and fairly as possible. NDHSCA maintains that credibility, honesty and integrity are probably some of the most important traits that can be developed in young athletes, coaches and citizens. If the Association ignores these traits, the Association, the Executive Committee, the All Star Chairs and the entire membership no longer are credible

Are the demands too great? The Association continues to make demands, and for the most part, most people respond best when great demands are made and expected. (\*\*\*\*box) Great expectations lead to great results.

The Association will continue to make great demands and have great expectations until the membership directs the Executive Committee to make changes.
