Ticket Policy at UND

UND has provided NDHSCA with a significant change regarding NDHSCA members' request for UND Athletic Contest tickets. The process will eliminate confusion for coaches and for UND Athletic Ticket Department. A member of the Association will be allowed to request 2 complimentary tickets for any of the Football, Volleyball, Men's & Women's Basketball, and Women's Hockey competitions. Ticket Policy at NDSU

The NDSU Athletic Ticket policy remains unchanged. For football game tickets, members need to call Gelaine Orvik, NDHSCA Executive Secretary, and request tickets for football games. Each member is entitles to one ticket but may purchase additional tickets through this process. The requests must be made before noon the day before the game (Friday for Saturday games). Gelaine will, in turn, contact NDSU Ticket Office with the list of NDHSCA members who have made the request.

Dr. Isrow, the instructor of record for the college credit attendants distributes an evaluation form for all students. This year soccer coaches were offered their first clinic sessions. Their four on-field sessions were followed with their soccer rules interpretation meeting. NDHSCA Victory Milestones



Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year. Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball



record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

- Only meets in which three or more schools participate will count as an invitational.
- Schools can still have a dual meet record that would remain the same along with a record for the invitationals they attend.
- It will be up to the individual coaches to determine their records from past years and update wins or revise their victory milestone forms.

POWERade Senior Athlete of the Year Guidelines

At the recent NDHSCA Coaches Convention Annual Meeting, the attending members passed accepted a recommended change to the POWERade Senior Athlete of the Year Selection Guidelines. The accepted changes to the guidelines for the nomination of the Senior Athlete are as follows:

- Have never been suspended from respective athletic team or the school of representation during academic senior year.
- Have never been suspended, disqualified, or ejected from a game, match, or contest for *conduct, behavior or violation of conduct* rules which would lead to suspension from the next contest in accordance with NDHSAA rules.

It is the duty of the individual coach to notify the nominating committee in each region or conference of the suspensions or disqualifications. The game disqualifications are limited to the conduct, behavior and sportsmanship aspects for each sport. These suspensions, disqualifications or ejections cover the entire season of the particular sport.

In the <u>email</u>, they need to include the 2 names of the people that will be picking up the tickets. Each person will need a picture ID and one of the two must provide a NDHSCA Membership card when they pick up and sign for the tickets.

The tickets are based on availability all requests are to be completed at least 48 hours prior to the event (UND has confirmed that they will not refuse tickets to NDHSCA Members after that time frame, but the requests will not be accepted at game time!).

This process is likely to simplify the ticket request process at UND. UND Athletic Director wants to make the process as painless as possible and wants to refrain from contacting individual coaches each week since they have a significant number of tasks and considerations on their minds during game week!



Gelaine will not forward any ticket requests from anyone who is not a member in good standing. Members may request additional tickets for the football games and pay for the additional tickets at the Will Call Window when the tickets are picked up.

When the NDHSCA members arrive at the Will Call Ticket Window, they must present their NDHSCA membership card and photo identification. NDHSCA and NDSU request no deviations from this policy.

Ticket requests will not be honored before Sunday before each week's game. There will be a limited number of tickets available for Homecoming and the South Dakota State games. The first 30 ticket requests made for those two games will be honored.

NDHSCA member admission to all other contests will continue with the same process as in the past with simply showing membership card at the admission gate.
