The 2008 Fall Season recipient of the Assistant Coach of the Year is **Mike Kamrath** from Washburn High School. Mike was nominated by Pete Moe, head football coach at Washburn High School.

Mike Kamrath has been a coach for 18 years with his past 11 years as an assistant football coach at Washburn High School. He has also been an assistant coach in track and field, head coach in track and field, and a junior high coach in football. Coach Kamrath's career coaching record is 73 wins and 35 losses. ## President's Message - Winter 2009

In high schools across North Dakota, the fall athletic seasons found thousands of students and coaches participating in seven different sports. Teams and individuals were recognized when the State Championships were awarded by the North Dakota High School Activities Association and the North Dakota High School Coaches Association sponsored awards for Outstanding Senior Athletes and Coach of the Year.

Congratulations to all the winners and participants!

Often times in the excitement of the season we forget to recognize and appreciate the efforts of another key group in the high school athletic experience... the officials. We often overlook the important role that officials play in the high school athletic experience. Too often we only see and focus on the "bad" call or a judgment call that did not go our way.

Officials see the action through unbiased eyes. Coaches, athletes, parents and fans are emotionally invested in each and every play, shot or move. Registered officials know the rules and are required to attend a rules clinic, officiating workshops, and take a written

test over the rules. They provide a fair playing field for all part i c i p a n t s. They play a vital role in the promotion and enforcement of

good sportsmanship and safety of our athletes. Officials must make instantaneous decisions constantly; and yes, some rules require an official to make a judgment call. The job is difficult and thankless on most nights. The officials are in the best position to view the action and make the call. Coaches and fans see a much different angle and view than the officials do. Officials do not find it helpful when coaches "assist" the officiating team from the sidelines anymore than we find the overzealous parent or fan helpful when we are coaching our team. Officials do not care who wins... I do not know of an official who has the time to contemplate, in his/her mind, a call and how it will affect the competition. The official simply makes the call as he/she sees it.

How a coach chooses to handle a disagreeable call will send a valuable message to the athletes, their parents and the fans. Avoid ranting and raving about how you, your team and athletes were slighted by the call. Coaches must model appropriate behavior and sportsmanship. If you must, take a quiet moment after the competition to discuss the call with the officials. Just as you would prefer a parent who does not agree with your decision visit with you privately rather than yell at you in front of the entire crowd and your team.

As coaches, we can help make the officiating experience a positive one for these men and women. With twenty-two years of coaching experience I have found that most of the time officials get it right. However, they are human and cannot always see everything that takes place during play. On occasion they just

plain get a call wrong. Accept the call and move on. Take the time to let them know when the job has been done well.They appreciate positive feedback.

High school athletics is a union of student athletes, coaches and officials. Each plays a different role allowing the student athletes to experience the gift of participation and competition. So as the seven winter and seven spring sports continue to seek their State Champions, Outstanding Senior Athletes, and Coaches' of the Year, let us recognize, appreciate and say "thank you" to the officials throughout our state. Their ethics, integrity, and professionalism help make high school competition a joy to watch.



**David Hoff** is a graduate of Bottineau High School and Minot State University; he also earned his Master's Degree from Minot State University. He is presently in his 20<sup>th</sup> year of teaching and coaching at Bottineau High School.

**Coach Hoff** is a member of North Dakota CTM and National CTM. He served as President of North Dakota's Chapter in 2004-2005. He was named Bottineau JC's Outstanding Educator in 1995, and he received the Walmart Teacher of the Year Award in 2000.

**Hoff** has coached Bottineau High School to 111 meet victories in Girls' Track & Field. His hockey teams have a 175-206-17 won-lost-ties record. His 2006 Girls' Track and Field team won a state title. Hoff is also a USA Hockey Education Instructor. He has coached Team North Dakota (Hockey) in 2004, 2005 & 2006. He has served on the NDHSAA/NDHSCA Hockey Advisory Committee for two terms.

**David** was named NDHSCA Hockey Coach of the Year in 1993. He was NDHSCA Girls' Track and Field Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006. He was named West Region Hockey Coach of the Year in 1993, 1995 and 2007. Coach Hoff has coached fourteen individual Girls' State Track and Field Champions.



**Gregg Grinsteinner** is a graduate of Dickinson Trinity High School and the Dickinson State University. Gregg is presently head coach of Dickinson Trinity High School boys' basketball, assistant coach for the Titans' Football and Titans' Junior High School Track & Field. He has been a member of the Titan staff for 25 years.

**Coach Grinsteinner** was named 1999 Teach of the Year by the Dickinson Chamber. He has been Knights of Columbus Youth Director knight of the month twice. He received the Dickinson State Blue Hawk Achievement Award in 2007. He is a member of Knights of Columbus, NCTM, NDCTM and NDHSCA.

**Gregg** has been head coach of the Trinity State Basketball Championship Team in 2004 and 2006. He was a member of the Trinity State Football Championship Staff in 200, 2001 and 2005. He just finished a term as member of the NDHSCA Boys' Basketball Advisory Committee to NDHSAA.

He was a Lions' All-Star Basketball Coach in 1999, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2007. He was a Mon-Dak All-Star Football Coach in 2000. **Grinsteinner** was named District 14 Coach of the Year and Region 7 Coach of the Year in 1999, 2006 and 2008. He was named North Dakota Associated Press Sportswriters and Sportscasters Coach of the Year in 2004.

**Bruce Anderson** is a graduate of New Rockford High School and Minot State University. He is a 37 year veteran coach at Grenora High School and Minot High School. He coached Boys' Basketball, Girls' Basketball and Baseball at Grenora for six year before becoming Head Girls' Basketball coach at Minot High School.

Anderson coached Grenora High School Girls' Basketball to a conference title in 1974, 1975 and 1976 as well as to district titles in 1974 and 1975. They also won their Regional Title in 1975. He mentored the Grenora Boys' Basketball teams to conference titles in 1975 and 1976. They were district champions in 1974 and 1975. **Bruce's** teams won district titles in Baseball in 1974, 1975 and 1976. Grenora was Regional baseball Runnerup Titlists in 1976.

**Coach Anderson** led the Minot Girls' Basketball teams to seven Western Dakota Association Titles (1980, 1981, 1982, 1984, 1987, 1992 and 2001). The Magicians were West Region Runnerup Titlists four times (1979, 1990, 1996 and 2000). The Minot Girls' Basketball teams were Regional Titlists eight times (1978, 1980, 1981, 1982, 1984, 1987, 1992 and 2001). **Bruce's** teams were State Runnerup Titlists three



times (1981, 2000 and 2001). They were state champions in 1978.

Anderson has guided his teams to 26 victories in baseball, 86 victories in boys' basketball and 526 victories in girls' basketball. The 526 girls' basketball victories is second in the all-time victories ladder in North Dakota Girls' Basketball. He has served on the NDHSCA/Lions' All-Star Basketball Selection Committee on seven occasions (1978, 1982, 1987, 1992, 1996, 2000 and 2001). The Magicians' Girls' Basketball teams have competed in the State Tournament 21 times.

Bruce has been recipient of the NDHSCA Class A Girls' Basketball West Region Coach of the Year Award on eight times and State Award winner on three occasions (1978, 1995 and 2001). He was selected North Dakota Female High School Team Coach of the Year in 1979 by the North Dakota Associated Press Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association. Anderson was nominated for NHSACA Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year five times (1980, 1989, 1991, 2003 and 2008). He was selected as a finalist for NHSACA Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year twice (2003 and 2008). In 2008 he was also nominated for the National Federation Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year and was also named Sectional Coach of the Year. He was NDHSCA-Lions Basketball All-Star coach in 1981 and 2001.

**Coach Anderson** was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Terry West. **Bruce** and his wife Nancy have two children: Jason and Michelle.



## Hall of Fame Inductee Joe Howell (continued from page 7)

Joe Howell is a graduate of Lisbon High School and Jamestown College. He began coaching at Lisbon High School in 1977 and has remained at his high school alma mater as a coach of the following sports: Boys' Track and Field for 32 years; Football for 15 years; Boys' Basketball for eleven year; Cross-Country for fourteen years; and athletic director for 32 years.

Howell coached the Broncos' Boys' Basketball to a District championship twice. His boys' Cross-Country teams won eight Conference Titles and nine Regional Championships. Joe was coach of the Bronco Football when the team won a state championship in 1992. His Boys' Track and Field teams have dominated the sport while winning 24 Southeast Conference indoor titles. Coach Howell's Bronco track and field athletes have also won 28 of 31 Regional Championships. They finished as Class B State Runnerup Titlists three times and Class B State Champions four times (1999, 2000, 2001 and 2005).

**Coach Howell's** basketball teams have secured 152 victories; his football teams have 21 victories and his baseball teams have 81 victories. The Lisbon High School Boys' Track and Field Teams have won 95% of the multi-team meets entered. His Cross-Country Teams have won 80% of the multi-team meets entered.



Joe has served his profession as the Class B Boys Representative on the NDHSCA Track and Field Advisory Committee to the North Dakota High School Activities Association and has been a member of NDHSCA every year of his coaching career. He has been a member of NDIAAA since becoming athletic administrator in 1999. He has frequently been a presenter at the NDHSCA Coaches Convention. He has also been a recurrent presenter at the NDSU Track and Field Coaches Clinic.

**Coach Howell** was a leader for the Lisbon Bronco "Track Backers". They built their own track and field complex; prior to the complex they hosted indoor and outdoor meets out of town. He started the Lisbon High School cross-country program in the fall of 1977.

Howell was named NDHSCA Class B Boys' Cross-Country Coach of the Year in 1990. He has been named NDHSCA Class B Boys' Track and Field Coach of the Year six times (1983, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2005). He was named Male Team High School Coach of the Year by the North Dakota Sportswriters & Sportscasters Association in 1993. Joe was recipient of the Rollie Greeno Award as the Jamestown College Alumni for Excellence in Teaching and Coaching in 2001. Joe was nominated for the NHSACA Boys' Track and Field National Coach of the Year by his state Association in 2005. The same year he was selected as National Coach of the Year Finalist and recipient of the NHSACA National Coach of the Year Award.

**Coach Howell** was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Brad Bittner.

Joe and his wife, Carmen, live in Kindred, North Dakota. Joe has two sons: Matthew (wife Casey and granddaughter, Tierney) and Christopher.  $\triangle$

Julie Stavn is a graduate of Harvey High School and Minot State University. She earned her Master's Degree at UND. She has spent her 31 vears of educating in the Bismarck School System: Simle Middle School, Bismarck High School and Century High School. She has coached gymnastics, basketball, volleyball, swimming & diving, crosscountry and track & field. She has been head coach of girls' crosscountry and girls' track and field at Bismarck Century High School since 1982.

Stavn has coached her crosscountry teams to Western Dakota Association Runnerup Titles in 1997, 2002 and 2008. Her swimming & diving teams were regional Runnerup Titlists in 1979, 1980 and 1982. The 1982 team also was North Dakota State Runnerup Titlists. Julie's Girls' Track and Field teams have won five West Region Runnerup Titles (1996, 1998, 1999, 2004 and 2008). Her 2005 team won the West Region Championship. In 2004 and 2008 the Patriots were second in the State Class A Girls' Track and Field Meet. 

Gary Walhaug is a graduate of Palermo High School and Minot State University. He began his coaching tenure at Tolley High School in the sports of Boys' Basketball, Girls' Basketball and Girls' Track and Field. Four years later Gary moved on to Surrey High School where he has continued his coaching the sports of Boys' Basketball, Girls' Basketball, Boys' Track and Field, Girls' Track and Field, Boys' Cross-Country and Girls' Cross-Country. In 1993 he began coaching at the University level as an assistant Women's Basketball and Men's Basketball Coach at Minot State University, where he continues his assistant coach duties

Walhaug coached his Girls' Track and Field teams to Conference Titles in 1989, 1997 and 2003; and to a Regional Title in 1987. His Cross-Country team won Conference Titles in 1977 and 1978, Regional Runnerup Title and State Runnerup Title in 1977. Gary mentored his Girls' Basketball Teams to six Conference Titles (1981, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1988). Surrey won five Girls' Basketball District Titles (1981, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986). He received NDHSCA Girls' Basketball Regional Coach of the Year Award in 1985. Walhaug was NDHSCA Boys' Basketball District Coach of the Year Award winner in 1983 and 1986. He was Lions' Basketball All-Star Assistant Coach in 1982 and 1987. He received Girls' Basketball 300 Victory Awards from Women's Basketball Coaches Association and Surrey High School in 1995. He received Girls' and Boys' Basketball 500 Victory Award from Surrey High School in 1996. Coach Walhaug received Victory Milestone Certificates in Girls' Basketball and Boys' Basketball from NDHSCA.

**Coach Walhaug** was nominated for NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Marj Bubach.



## **NDHSCA Victory Milestones**



Please help the NDHSCA keep your records current. Each coach must send their record at the completion of each season. If coaching more than one sport, complete each sport on a separate form. If you are completing the victory milestone for the first time, make sure to give your record for each year. Report only the highest level of coaching each season. Don't add coaching seasons together (ex. if a coach is coaching both jr. high boys basketball and varsity basketball, count only the varsity basketball



record for that season). If coaching both varsity girls' and varsity boys' basketball, count each season on separate forms and don't add together as one record. Under the new format for counting victories in certain sports such as track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming, and gymnastics; the old records will need to be updated. Remember to keep each sport season separate and always report the highest level of coaching in each sport.

### Procedure For Determining Won/Loss Records In An Invitational Meet:

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)

## Some Plays Just Don't Fit in the Box Score

Pasco, WA: The Pasco High girls' basketball team's leading scorer tore an ACL and MCL jumping up and down celebrating her winning shot in the district playoffs.

Southport, NC: A judge ruled that the parents of a teenager who married her 40-year-old high school track coach could not sue the school district. The coach resigned from South Brunswick High in June 2007, on the same day he married the 16-yearold.

Canton, GA: The stadium announcer for Sequovah High football came under fire for comments he made during a game, including, "You can boo all you want, but you're still losing 49-0."

Katy, TX: Seven Morton Ranch High varsity cheerleaders grabbed junior varsity cheerleaders from their homes, blindfolded them, bound their hands and threw them in a swimming pool. The school suspended cheerleading for the school year.

Lewisberry, PA: Upon reporting to school for preseason conditioning, a Red Land High football coach and players discovered a deer carcass propped up and chained to a turnstile. The deer was wearing a white muscle shirt, shorts and a graduation cap atop its headless body and had a football stuffed between its legs.

Bethel, VT: Whitcomb High boys' basketball players told their coach by phone on a Saturday that they did not want to play in their first-round playoff game Monday. "We just decided enough was one player said. enough." Sixteenth-seeded Whitcomb (3-16) was set to face top-seeded Proctor (18-0), a team that had beaten Whitcomb 87-22 earlier in the season.

Groveland, FL: A melee broke out after a fuse blew and a football game between South Lake and Nature Coast was plunged into darkness. Five players and a coach were suspended for their roles in the on-field brawl. According to a report filed about the incident, "for a few seconds after the blackout there was no activity on the field. We could then hear players beginning to hit each other."

Springboro, OH: Private donors funded a Springboro High boys' basketball locker room that includes custom-made roval blue and white carpet with the school logo, wooden lockers with lockable personal drawers, a 10-foot TV, a Wii video game system and a hardwood entryway that when completed will be a replica of the floor the team plays on.

**Provo.** UT: A newspaper photographer whose leg was pierced by a javelin that came through the other side photographed his injury before going to the hospital. "If I didn't, it would probably be my editor's first question when I got back," he said.

Flower Mound, TX: Two students who dressed in gorilla and banana costumes and sprinted down the field at a football game spent 16 hours in jail for trespassing. "We were in there with people on drug charges," the gorilla said. "When they asked what we did, they said: 'Seriously?' "

Wausau. WI: An Antigo High student was arrested after he ran nearly naked through the Wausau West High field house during a boys' basketball game. A police officer found the student standing on the street a few blocks from the school wearing light tan bikini underwear and with his hands covering his groin. It was about 15 degrees outside.

Oklahoma City, OK: On the night that Bishop McGuinness High School debuted its newly renovated gym, a \$4 million project, one of the home players shattered a backboard on a dunk attempt.


