NDHSCA Executive Committee announces the inductees to the 2011 NDHSCA Hall of Fame as determined at its recent NDHSCA Executive Committee Meeting.

The recipients are **Ron Carl**son, Dallas Kopp, Leland Opp, Mike Schats and Randy Vigen.

The inductees will be recognized and receive awards during the 2011 NDHSCA Coaches Convention, held on July 26-29, 2011 in Mandan. The Hall of Fame Awards will be presented at the Annual Banquet on Thursday, July 28th.

NHSACA Inductees Hall of Fame

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Executive Committee selected **Leon House**, former head boys' and girls' cross-country coach and assistant track & field coach at Mandan High School and **Joel Howell**, head boys' track & field coach and formerly head boys' basketball coach, head football coach as inductees into the 2011 National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Hall of Fame. The Awards will be presented at a noon luncheon on Tuesday, June 21st, 2011 at the NHSACA National Annual Meeting.

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Coach Education Committee Proposal

The Coach Education Committee held its final meeting for development of the proposal for North Dakota Coaches in Minot on Friday, November 19th.

Steve Dunrud is a graduate of Fosston (MN) High School and Mayville State University. He is presently in his 20th year of teaching and coaching at Rolla School and High presently at Bottineau High School. He has coached football, volleyball, track

& field and boys' basketball.

Dunrud's coaching record in football is 116 wins with 51 losses; he has coached his teams to 303 victories in volleyball with 228 losses.

Coach Dunrud has provided professional service as a member of the volleyball advisory committee for one term. He has served as a speaker at the NDHSCA Coaches Convention several times.

Steve has been honored as football Regional Coach of the Year four times (1989, 1993, 1994 and 1999). He was named volleyball District Coach of the Year five times (1998, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2005), before being named volleyball Regional Coach of the Year five times (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001). He was also named track and field Regional Coach of the Year in 2005. Dunrud served as assistant football coach for the NDHSCA-Shrine football game in 1995 and 2000.

Jason Kersten, Bottineau High School Superintendent endorses Mr. Dunrud as a Vice Presidential candidate for NDHSCA. Lisa Strand is a graduate of Northwood High School, with her undergraduate degrees from Moorhead State University and Mayville State University. She coached for 22 years at Thompson High School. She has coached volleyball, girls' basketball, and track and field.

Coach Strand has coached her teams to a 656-155 record in volleyball in 22 seasons. Her girls' basketball teams have a 129-105 record over a 11 year span. She

has not compiled her record while serving as head track and field coach for five seasons.

Strand has coached her volleyball teams to state championships four times (1997, 1998, 2004 and 2005). She also coaches the Thompson Elementary volleyball program. She also serves as coach of Thompson community T-ball, little league baseball, softball and Junior Babe Ruth baseball. Coach Strand also served as Assistant Athletic Director at Thompson High School (2002-2006).

Lisa has served as a member of the volleyball advisory committee for one term. She has just begun her second year as the NDHSCA-Optimists' All-Star Volleyball Co-Chair position.

Strand has been selected volleyball District Coach of the Year four times (1995, 1999, 2002 and 2003) and volleyball Regional Coach of the Year four times (1997, 1998, 2008 and 2010). She was also selected as NDHSCA Volleyball State Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2008 by her peers. Lisa was recognized by NDHSCA with a Certificate of Merit for 500 volleyball victories. She has coached the NDHSCA-Optimists' Volleyball Series four times (1995, 1998, 2005 and 2006).

Lisa has been endorsed as a candidate for NDHSCA Vice President by Thompson High School Superintendent, Jerry Bartholomay. Lisa and her husband Kevin have two children: Jace and Jettie.



-From the Executive Secretary's Desk

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! I know that I am about a month behind schedule with the publication of the *Dakota Coach*, but I have enjoyed myself. People have often asked me "What are you doing now that you have retired?" Well, the truth is that I have not retired! I am not teaching and coaching, but I have continued with my life in other ways.

One of the most enjoyable tasks I perform is to orchestrate the activities of NDHSCA. I have enjoyed this for over 30 years and hope to continue for another year or so, the Lord willing, the Red River does not sweep my Condo off its foundation, and NDHSCA Members continue with their faith in my performance. Really, only a few more years!

By now, most NDHSCA Members are fully aware of the view of our Association regarding Coaching Education. One of the lead front-page articles is on that topic. We must be prepared to stand up and defend our preparations to coach and our continued efforts to become better coaches.

Our efforts do not include the actual certification process that a doctor or an athletic trainer goes through. NHSACA went through that process to register as the official certifying agency with National Organization of Certifying Agencies in 1990. That certifying process is much more detailed and certifies that the candidate has displayed knowledge in the many domains of the said profession by answering examination questions that measure possession and use of the information required for the profession.

The goal of The NDHSAA *Ad hoc* committee on coaches' education is to prepare us to become better coaches. Coaches will not have a greater knowledge of X and O, sport specific fundamentals and skills, or contest planning wisdom. The goal of the committee has been to prepare us to be better coaches and teachers with tools that coaches use every day:

basic fundamentals to teach and to coach athletics

• understanding concussions in sports

• Basic first aid knowledge that includes care and prevention of athletic injuries

• CPR certification (that is being required more and more of all personnel in all professions when working with other people)

I am committed to this process of educating the NDHSCA Members and the NDHSCA Executive Committee has committed support for the proposal. Last summer, when we presented the status of the committee's recommendation, we had no dissenting voice; that leads us to an enhanced support. The details for reporting "course completion, record-

keeping and certificate issuance has been prepared, reviewed and given a preliminary launch. All systems are operable and workable.

Since the beginning of the school year a few alarming news items have been very loud to my ears and the coaching leadership: Elk River (MN) HS football hazing incident, Moorhead (MN) HS Hockey hazing incident, the Fargo School bullying incident, the Fargo South HS gun incident, the Fargo North HS knife incident and others. I am not so naïve as to think that these are the only incidents in school systems that have occurred.

I am brought back to my senses that all these developments will continue if we as coaches, teachers, parents and concerned citizens put our heads into the sand. We need to be involved and extra cognizant of what is happening. Every coach and teacher needs to be more observant in our supervision. Our jobs are never done; our management and control has never been more important.

During the session that I present at the Coaches Convention, I allude to the participation by coaches and teachers in developing training rules and guidelines. Whenever we step back because "everything is operating so smoothly", that is when we will most surely see more and different illegal and unwanted drug, tobacco and alcohol use, misuse and abuse than we can imagine. We must continue our perceptiveness!

Snow and blizzards are upon us! We continue to have postponements and cancellations. We must have our ear to the weather bureau's warnings and advisories constantly. Our responsibility in cancellations should always be to err on the side of safety.


The recipients for the 2011 induction will be Ron Carlson, head Boys' Basketball, Football and Track and Field Coach at Minnewaukan North High School; **Dallas Kopp**, retired head Footbal, Girls' Golf, Girls' Track and Field, Baseball and Assistant Basketball Coach at Grand Forks Red River High School, Grand Forks Central High School and Larimore High School; Leland Opp, head Girls' Track and Field, Boys' and Girls' Cross -Country, Boys' Basketball, and Girls' Basketball Coach at Hazen High School; Mike Schatz, retired Head Football. Boys' Basketball. Boys' Golf. and Boys' Track and Field Coach at Ellendale High School and New England High School; and Randy Vigen, Head Football Coach, Boys' Basketball, Assistant Boys' Basketball, Junior High School Boys' Basketball Coach and Athletic Director at Central Valley (Buxton) High School. They will receive their awards at the NDHSCA Annual Awards Banguet that will be held at 6:30 PM at the Mandan Seven Seas Best Western Conference Center.

Ron Carlson is a 35 year coaching veteran with all his experience at Minnewaukan High School (1974-2008); however Minnewaukan cooped with Sheyenne (1990-2003) and with Leeds High School (2004-2008). During his coaching tenure at Minnewaukan HS he coached boys' basketball, track and field and football.

Ron is a graduate of Portland High School and Mayville State University. He earned his graduate degree from NDSU.

In 1976 **Coach Carlson** led the Midgets to a conference Football title. Thereafter his major coaching duties were centered on boys' basketball. Carlson's boys' basketball teams won 14 conference titles and 12 district championships. He mentored Minnewaukan to seven Regional basketball runner up titles and four Regional Championships.

Carlson's football teams won 28 victories over a five year span while the Minnewaukan boys' basketball teams won 578 victories for Ron.

Ron Carlson served his profession at many levels. He was a member of the NDHSCA Boys' Basketball Advisory Committee to NDHSAA (1990-1992). Ron was a Co-Chair of the NDHSCA/NHSACA National Coaches Convention Boys' Basketball host committee in 2001 when the National Convention was held in Fargo. He chaired the CND Conference for the 1978-1979 year. Carlson served on the NDHSAA Board of Directors (2002-2006). He presently is an active member of the Mayville State University Alumni Association where he has been active since 2004. In 2006 Ron was recipient of the Mayville State Distinguished Alumni Award.

Coach Carlson was recognized by the Minnewaukan City Council as Citizen of the Year in 1995. He was awarded NDHSCA District Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year Honor in 1987, 1995, 2000, 2002, 2007 and 2008. Ron was tabbed NDHSCA Region 4 boys' basketball Coach of the Year in 1990, 1995, 2000, 2002, 2007 and 2008 by his peers. He was also named NDHSCA Class B State Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year in 2000.

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Ron Carlson was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Mike Callahan, Minnewaukan High School's Athletic Director.

Ron and his wife, Claudette, have three children: Jennifer, Ryan and Joanna; they also have nine grandchildren.



Dallas Kopp behis 40 year gan coaching career as head football coach. head baseball coach and assistant boys' basketball coach at High Larimore School (1960-1962) before he moved to Grand Forks to become assistant football coach at Central High School (1962-1967). He completed his coaching tenure as head

football coach, head girls' track and field coach and head girls' golf coach at Red River High School (1967-2000).

Kopp led the Roughrider girls' golf teams to eight Eastern Dakota Conference championships. He also guided the Red River High School girls' golf teams to six East Region Runner up titles. Dallas led those Roughrider girls' golf teams to two State Championships in 1988 and 1990. In 1987 mentored his Red River girls' track and field team to a second place finish at the state meet. Kopp has a football win-lost record of 51-50.

Coach Kopp was recognized by his peers as NDHSCA Class A Girls' Golf Coach of the Year three times (1985, 1989 and 1995). Dallas has refereed several state basketball tournaments as well as college and university contests. He also, has umpired the American Legion Baseball World Series.

Coach Kopp was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Gelaine Orvik, NDHSCA Executive Secretary. **Dallas** and his wife, Beth, have four children: Mike, Jode, Dan and Mark.



Leland Opp

Leland Opp is a graduate of Hazen High School and Minot State University. He has spent his entire 25 year coaching profession at Hazen High School. He has served as coach of boys' and girls' cross-country, boys' and girls' basketball and girls' track and field at Hazen. He and his wife, Jennifer, have two children: son, Jarett, and daughter, Allison.

Coach Opp has directed the Hazen Bison to Badland Conference titles in girls' track and field 11 years. The Bison also won District Championships in girls' basketball twice. He guided Hazen to Region Runner up titles in girls' basketball in 2010; girls' cross-country in 1991, 1992 and 1993; and boys' cross-country in 1992 and 1993. Hazen High School won Regional Girls' Track and Field Championships 20 times and a Girls' Basketball Championship in 2009 with Leland at the helm. Opp conducted the Bison to State Runner up Titles in Girls' Track and Field (2010), Girls' Cross-Country (1992 and 1993) and Boys' Cross-Country (1992 and 1993). Coach Opp's Girls' Track and Field Teams won State Championships seven times and his Girls' Cross-Country won a State Title once (1991).

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In two years **Leland** has coached the Girls' Basketball teams to a 46-4 record. His cross-country teams have a 50-35 win-loss record. The Bison Girls' Track and Field teams have a 215-39 record with Opp at the controls.

Opp has served his profession as a member of the NDHSCA Cross-Country Advisory Committee to NDHSAA (1991-1992). He also served on the NDHSCA Track and Field Advisory Committee to NDHSAA (1996-2000). Leland has been a speaker at the NDHSCA Coaches Convention on four occasions and at the NHSACA Coaches Convention four times.

Leland Opp has been recognized as NDHSCA West Region Girls' Cross -Country Coach of the Year twice (1991 and 1992) and NDHSCA West Region Boys' Cross-Country Coach of the Year once (1993). He has also been honored by his peers as NDHSCA Region 5 Girls' Track and Field Coach of the Year 17 times. Opp has been selected as NDHSCA Girls' Cross-Country State Coach of the Year once (1992) and Girls' Track and Field State Coach of the Year eight times. The North Dakota Associated Press Sportscasters and Sportswriters selected Leland's Girls' Track and Field teams and Female High School Team of the Year in 1994 and 1998. Coach Opp was nominated for NHSACA Girls' Track and Field National Coach of the Year (1998) as well as in 2001, 2004 and 2008, when he was also name one of eight finalists for the National Award.

Coach Opp was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by Randy Johnson, Hazen High School teaching and coaching cohort who is also a member of the NDHSCA Executive Committee.

Mike Schatz has coached football, boys' basketball, golf, and track and field during his 27 years in his coaching profession. He taught one year at Ellendale High School and 26 vears at his home high school in New England. He retired in 2005.

Mike and his wife, Patti, have four children: Sarah, Jamestown; Nathan, Grand Forks; Amber, Bismarck and Joshua, Pensacola, FL.

Coach Schatz is a

graduate of New England High School and Minot State University where he played football for Coach Kenny Becker.

Schatz coached New England to 14 Western Roughrider Football Conference Titles. New England won a State Nine-Man Football Runner up title in 1985 and State Nine-Man Football Championships in 1988, 1995, 1996 and 1997 with Mike as head coach. While Coach Schatz directed his football teams 203 victories, the tigers held a 47 game winning streak.

Mike Schatz was a member of the NDHSCA Football Advisory Committee to NDHSAA for one term (1986-1988). He has served on the New England Park Board for 20 years and held the office of President. Mike was President of the New England Education Association for seven years (1991-1998). Coach Schatz served on the Education Standards and Practices Board for eight years (1993-2001) and is an active member of many civic and governmental organizations. He was elected as a Representative to the North Dakota Legislative Assembly in 1988 and again in 2008. He is a retired social studies teacher and is currently engaged in business.

Mike was selected as Western Roughrider Conference Nine-Man Football Coach of the Year 12 times and was honored with three (1988, 1995 and 1997) NDHSCA State Nine-Man Football Coach of the Year Awards. Schatz served as head coach for the Shrine Football Game in

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1996, 1997 and 1998. He was an assistant coach for the game in 1986, 1989 and 1992. He was nominated for NHSACA National Football Coach of the Year and was a finalist in 2000.

Mike Schatz was nominated for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame by one of his former quarterbacks, Brian Flyberg, an outstanding girls' basketball coach at Linton High School..

Randy Vigen is a graduate of Hatton High School and Mayville State University. He and his wife, Doris, have three children: Brent, Brooks and Brittany. They also have six grandchildren.

Randy has spent his entire 36 years in the coaching profession at Central Valley (Buxton) High School. While at Central Valley he has been head football coach for the duration; he was also head boys' basketball coach for seven years. He served as an assistant boys' basketball coach for three years and a junior high boys' basketball coach for 17 years. He has been athletic director for 33 years. **Vigen** has guided this football team to Tall Towers Conference Titles in 1975 and 1983; he also had a boys' basketball Tall Towers Conference title in 1979. Vigen's Central Valley teams qualified for the playoffs fourteen years; they advanced to the playoff quarterfinals in 1992, 2001 and 2006. Central Valley also played in the playoff semifinals in 1981, 1998 and 1999. The Valiants won the State Nine-Man Football Championship in 1999.

Coach Vigen owns a 72-74 won-loss record in boys' basketball. His teams have amassed a 198-139 record in football.

Randy served as President of the Tall Towers Conference for the 1989-1990 school year. He was also President of the Red River Valley Conference for 2005-2006. Vigen was Chairman of District 3 for 2000-2001; he has served as Chairman of Region 2 football from 2002-2005 and Region 3 from 2006-2008. Coach Vigen was on the NDHSCA Football Advisory Committee from 2001-2010.

Vigen was named NDHSCA State Nine-Man Football Coach of the Year in 1981. His peers named him NDHSCA Football Region Coach of the Year on eight occasions (1991, 1992, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2006. The NDIAAA named Randy Class B State Athletic Director of the Year in 2001. In 2004 Randy was named Class Nobel Educator of Distinction by the National Society of High School Scholars. Vigen was named NSAA-USA Football Champions Awards by USA Football in 2005. Randy was a finalist for the American Football Coaches Association Power of Influence Award in 2009 and 2010. He served as head coach for North Dakota Shrine All-Star Game in 2000 and as assistant coach five times (1999, 2001, 2001, 2005 and 2006). Central Valley High School named the football field Randy Vigen Field in honor of Coach Vigen in 2007.

Jason Brend, Central Valley High School staff, nominated Randy Vigen for the NDHSCA Hall of Fame.

Coach Education Committee Proposal (continued from page 1)

The recommendations should be reviewed by all member coaches. Input or recommendations should be shared with the NDHSCA Office (Gelaine Orvik) or sent directly to the NDHSAA office. The Committee will make final recommendations at the January NDHSAA Board of Directors Meeting in Bismarck.

Recommendations:

1. Beginning July 2012, all 7-12 coaches will be required to possess a coaching permit.

2. The coaching permit will be valid for five years.

3. Member schools will be responsible for documentation of all coaches' education information, NDHSAA will be the permit clearing house and the North Dakota High School Coaches Association will provide the coaching permit certificate.

4. To secure a coaching permit, the following courses must be completed:

a. NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching.

b. NFHS Concussion in Sports.

c. First Aid Safety - may be offered locally or through NFHS/Red Cross. If completed after the 2007-08 fiscal school year this requirement will be satisfied.

d. Current CPR Certification.

6. Coaching Permit renewal

a. Every five years, eight approved contact class hours will be required. An example would be NDHSCA Convention Seminar Sessions.

b. Verification of contact hours will be submitted by an administrator of the member school.

7. Member schools may apply for a temporary emergency coaching permit for a coach not meeting requirements (permit valid for one fiscal year).

This is an awesome professional development for our coaches and for our profession. Every coach needs to be aware of the requirements! This will be a concurrent requirement for every coach's academic requirement. As a coach, we have about 18 months to prepare for permit requirement.

Leon House was born and raised in Mandan, North Dakota. After graduating from Mandan High School in 1961, coach House attended Dickinson State College where he graduated with a degree in physical education and biology.

Leon's teaching and coaching career began in 1965 at St. Mary's High School in Devils Lake, North Dakota. He coached football, basketball, and track & field for two years.

In the fall of 1967, Coach House went to Watford City High School where he coached cross-country, basketball, and track & field for the next seven years.

In the fall of 1974, **Leon** began teaching and coaching basketball and track & field at Fort Yates High School. He then moved to Mandan in 1975 to begin coaching football, basketball and track & field at Mandan Junior High School. Coach House assumed the Mandan High School cross-country program in 1981 and held that position for 23 years.





- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- C. Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss record for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)
- Only meets in which three or more schools participate will count as an invitational.
- Schools can still have a dual meet record that would remain the same along with a record for the invitationals they attend.


