North Dakota Has Three National COTY Recipients

Three NDHSCA Coach of the Year Nominees were recipients of the NHSACA National Coach of the Year at the National Awards Banquet. They are John Hutchison, Hatton-Northwood HS; Greg LaDouceur, Grand Forks Red River HS; and Darrell Anderson, Bismarck HS; they are all outstanding coaches and people.

John Hutchison, retired athletic director at Northwood High School, was named National Athletic Director of the Year. John is a graduate of Hillsboro High School and Mayville State University. He has spent 42 years as an athletic director and coach. John has been a district and regional tourney manager for NDHSAA over 35 times. Recently he was a member of the building committee for a new school---that includes two gymnasiums, a weight room and four locker rooms.

John has been a member of the NDHSACA Executive Committee from 1977 through 1981, when he was President in 1980. He has since been Assistant Executive Secretary in charge of Coach of the Year and Athlete of the Year selection four 23 years. He served on the NHSACA National Executive Committee 2001-2005, serving as President in 2003-2004. He continues on the NHSACA Board of Directors as Athletic Director National Chair and as Past President.

Hutch was named NDHSCA Athletic Director of the Year in 1985 and inducted into the NDHSCA Hall of Fame in 2000. He was finalist for

From Your Executive Secretary

What a grand summer and Annual Coaches Convention. We were blessed with an incomparable contribution from North Dakota Coaches in making the 2012 gathering a convention that all those who attended will long remember.

A special Thank you needs to be extended to NHSACA President Dave Dougherty as he kept all details from NHSACA under surveillance and completed. Dave made 2011-2012 a remarkable year for our National Association. Of course we have come to expect his exactness with details to make all his work phenomenal! Of course, Danielle is of great assistance to him. Thank you, Dave and Danielle.

The 2012-2013 membership is flying forward! As of this column's composition, our membership numbers are at 835. That compares to 691 on the same date last year. We reached 859 on October first last year. Our final membership count for 2011-2012 was 1152; that is an all-time membership record for NDHSCA. Obviously, NDHSCA is doing something right since our membership numbers keep rising each year. First, Randy Johnson has been incomparable with delivering our messages to remind all members from previous years of registration time. Also, Karen and Rod Hardie have worked endlessly to get membership cards to each coach as he or she sends in registrations. Thank you Randy, Karen and Rod! Also, thank you to each coach for membership.

As you may have heard, our final registration numbers for our 2012 Convention were 417. That is a new, modern-day record. In 1991 our registration for the NDHSCA-NHSACA National Convention was nearly 500. We have not been near that number since. Thank you to each coach who registered and attended.

We were deeply saddened with the passing of our Past President Bob Feeney. Bob was a remarkable man who carried his family and team on his sleeve. His teams achieved marvelous heights and records. Our condolences to Jan and her children as we remember Bob's Legacy!

Do you have a first year coach in your school? Be sure to extend a special invitation to all first year coaches to join your Association!

As most coaches know, the Coaches Education Requirement. Beginning with 2013 every coach will be required to have accomplished specific preparation for entering the coaching profession. As a professional each coach will have completed the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching Course (on-line, blended classroom, or while in col-

lege within the past two years), completed the NFHS Concussion Management Course and complete a First Aid Course. In addition, each coach will be required to be certified in CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and in use of AED (automated external defibrillator).

The coaching permit must be renewed every five years (except for the CPR requirement). Coaches who have graduated from college with a coaching minor, which includes Fundamentals of Coaching, First Aid, CPR and Concussion Management, will be given a Coaching Permit, if the coach has graduated from college within four years of the application for the permit. Each school's activities director or high school principal is responsible for record-keeping and submission of the NDHSAA Coaches Permit Completion verification. A Permit Certificate will be sent to each coach from NDHSCA! All certified coaches with permits will be posted on the NDHSAA website.

Another special thank you to Universal Athletics for their hosting the famous "Taco Bar Social" with their unique "Beverage Can Races"! A great time was had by all. Also, a special thank you to all who participated in the activities that netted the Scholarship Fund \$410! Then Larry Aasheim, Universal Athletics President, made his announcement that he would provide another \$1,000.00 to the fund. Thank you, Larry and Universal Athletics!

Do you have a first year coach in your school? Be sure to extend a special invitation to all first year coaches to join your Association! They need to begin their preparation for Coaching Permits!

In all, NDHSCA paid NHSACA \$21,885 for fees and NHSACA registrations.

In the words of the old nursery rhyme, "Isn't that fancy dish to set before the King?"

North Dakota was treated to another moment in the sun when three coaches (John Hutchison, Darrell Anderson and Greg LaDouceur) were named NHSACA National Coach of the Year. David Dougherty, present NHSACA President, and Randy Johnson, newly-elected NHSACA Third Vice-President, were recognized as recipients of the NHSACA National Distinguished Service Award Recipients. Those two awards were presented at the NDHSCA Hall of Fame and Coach of the Year Banquet. Jerry Lyon, former Minot Tennis Coach, and Curt Sherbrooke, Bismarck Schools gymnastics coach, were inducted into the NHSACA Hall of Fame.

With Fargo Mayor Walaker presenting a "Fargo Welcome", Lieutenant Governor Drew Wrigley presented a keynote address on the opening day of the NHSACA Annual Meeting. NDHSCA was very proud of the day as our state again dazzled the nation's visiting coaches with an incomparable presentation. On Wednesday, Governor Dalrymple provided our NHSACA guests with a welcome to the Peace Gar-

den State, the most envied state in the union with its virtually non-existent unemployment and unparalleled state treasury surplus.

Rod Olson, former assistant coach at Jamestown College and former FCA speaker, served as the NHSACA General Session on the final day of the National Annual Meeting. Mr. Olson also was a visiting speaker on Thursday morning at the FCA Breakfast.

The only unexpected complication that occurred was the cancellation of our keynote football speaker. Bill Williams was recommended by several coaches and is a repeated speaker at the Montana Convention. He had an accident on his flight day and his doctor advised him against travel. However, as NDHSCA has come to expect, other coaches (Kelly Kalina and Brent Miller) came to the rescue; they made presentations with virtually no preparation time. Thank you, Kelly and Brent!

The 2013 NDHSCA Coaches Convention has been set for July 23-July 26th at the Mandan Seven Seas Best Western. Begin today by making reservations (you know about the oil boom demand on rooms!) and plans for attending.

NDHSCA Executive Committee Adopts On-Line Registration

The NDHSCA Executive Committee passed a motion at its July meeting to implement usage of online Registration beginning with the 2013-2014 Membership year. The online registration will allow coaches to have instant registration and to facilitate usage of credit cards for payment. Online registration will allow for last minute registration and will enhance ease for coaches to complete the form.

The online form will be found on the NDHSCA website and will require coaches to maintain more complete records. Registration will require the completion of information for each "box" before moving on to the next "box". In that the registrations will

be an additional cost item, the membership fee will be increased from \$55 to \$60 for annual registration. The form will not be placed on the website until after the NDHSCA March Executive Committee to prevent registration complications with registration for the 2012-2013 membership. Reminders will be issued periodically by Email.

NHSACA National Athletic Director of the Year in 2005, 2008 and 2012. John was inducted into the NHSACA Hall of Fame in 2002 and into the NDIAAA Hall of Fame in 2009. In 2001 he was recipient of the Outstanding Alumni Award from Mayville State University. He received the NHSACA Distinguished Service Award in 2000. He received the Carey McDonald Citation from NHSACA and in 2009, the Dwight Keith Award, the most prestigious award presented by NHSACA.

Greg LaDouceur has been head boys' tennis at Grand Forks Central (11) and Grand Forks Red River HS (11) for his entire head coaching experience. He has also spent seven years as assistant girls' tennis coach before serving as head girls' coach this past year. He has coached his teams to a 433 wins and 55 losses team record over that period. Since his tenure at Red River HS, his teams have posted a perfect 150-0 team dual record. The Roughriders added to his perfect record in the fall of 2011.

Coach LaDouceur has served on the NDHSCA Advisorv Committee to NDHSAA for four terms. He has also been a perennial speaker at the NDHSCA Coaches Convention, as well as speaking at the NHSACA National Coaches Annual Meeting.

Greg's teams have won every state championship (11) during his head coaching tenure at Red River HS. His Central HS team also won a state championship (1998) and a state runner up title (1997). LaDouceur has also coached five state singles champions and 10 state doubles champions.

Coach LaDouceur has been recipient of eight NDHSCA Boys' Tennis East Region Coach of the Year Awards. He has also been named NDHSCA Boys' Tennis State Coach of the Year five times. He has been named NHSACA Tennis National Coach of the Year Finalist three times (2006, 2009 and 2012). He was also named National Federation High School Coaches Association Midwest Section Coach of the Year in 2005.

Darrell Anderson has spent his entire 32year coaching career at Bismarck HS, where he also attended high school. He is a graduate of NDSU. The Demons have defeated 2340 teams and lost to only 178 teams during his head coaching tenure. He has served his profession by serving on the NDHSCA Advisory Committee to NDHSAA and as Finance Chair for the NHSACA National Coaches Convention in 1991, when North Dakota hosted its first National Convention. He has been a speaker at the state and national conventions on numerous occasions.

The Demons have won eleven State Track & Field Championships and four Runners up titles while he was head and/or co-head coach. They have won the past eight championships in succession. The Demons have been undefeated for four years while Darrell has been co-head coach. Anderson has also been head coach and/or cohead coach for 15 Western Dakota Region Championships.

Coach Anderson has been named NDHSCA Girls' Cross-Country Coach of the Year twice, NDHSCA Boys' Cross-Country Coach of the Year five times, and NDHSCA Boys' Track & Field Coach of the Year eight times. He was recipient of the NHSACA Boys' Track & Field National Coach of the Year Finalist Award in 2006, 2009 and 2012; he was NHSACA Boys' Cross-Country National Coach of the Year Finalist Award recipient in 2007 and 2010.

The NHSACA National Awards Banquet was held at the Fargo Holiday Inn on Tuesday, July 24th.


Reminder!

We are in the preparation period for the initial date for Coaching Permit (August 1, 2013). Know your requirements and begin today to satisfy them!

NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Fund

The NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Fund has reached an asset level for the first scholarship to be taken from the fund for awarding at the July, 2013 NDHSCA Convention. The \$1,000 Scholarship will be made available to any graduate of any North Dakota High School who will enroll in a North Dakota college or university.

The candidate must declare an intention to become an interscholastic coach. The scholarship application narrative and application form will be reviewed by local college/university compliance personnel to insure acceptable and preferred verbiage to be acceptable for recipients to maintain scholarship status at



North Dakota colleges and/or universities.

The application document and form will be reviewed and accepted by the NDHSCA Executive Committee at its November meeting. The scholarship will be awarded at the July NDHSCA Coaches Convention.

The Scholarship fund received a substantial rejuvenation in July when it received \$410 from the Universal Athletics Coaches Social donation and a \$1,000 donation from Larry Aasheim, president of Universal Athletics. Negotiations are ongoing with a possible sponsoring company that will provide a second \$1,000 scholarship each year.

NDHSCA Members are reminded that additional contributions are constantly needed to replenish the fund since the \$1,000 withdrawal each year will deplete the fund over an eleven year period.

Some coaches make a tax-deductible contribution annually when they pay their membership registration or convention registration. Other coaches make periodic contributions as memorials to fellow coaches who have made significant contributions to North Dakota Coaching and Athletics. Some coaches make a contribution to honor special people (spouse, child, athlete, etc.) in a coach's life. contribution form is found in each issue of the *Dakota Coach* and on the NDHSCA website.

- A. In an invitational meet, the teams that finish below you will count as victories, those that finish above you are losses. Any teams that you tie will count as a win.
- B. Figure out the total number of teams you have competed against and what percentage of those teams were wins and losses.
- Take the percentage of wins/losses from above and multiply it against the number of meets you participated in to arrive at your won/loss re-C. cord for the season.
- D. If this is not a whole number, victories will always be rounded down and losses will be rounded up. (Obviously, if your team has participated in ten meets during the year, your wins plus losses should equal ten.)
- Only meets in which three or more schools participate will count as an invitational.
- Schools can still have a dual meet record that would remain the same along with a record for the invitationals they attend.

The 2012 NDHSCA Annual Meeting was called to order by President Gregg Grinsteinner at 2:00 PM on Thursday, July 26, 2012 with 172 NDHSCA members present.

Matt Herman moved to approve the 2011 Annual Meeting Minutes as they were written in the *Dakota Coach*; Mike Sorlie seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Gelaine Orvik reviewed the 2011-2012 financial report. Gelaine reported the June 30, 2012 Account Balances as follows:

Carolyn Olson moved to approve the financial report as presented; Scott Grochow seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Gelaine Orvik presented an update on the 2012-2013 NDHSCA/NHSACA Coaches Convention update as follows:

406 Registered for convention (as of July 26, 2012)

491 Membership Registration (includes Convention Registrations)

148 College Credits (36 – 1 credit registrations; 46 – 2 credit registrations)

56 registered for golf, 64 played golf, and 54 paid for golf

Need to pay for golf.

This sets a new record since 1991 when we hosted the National Convention in Bismarck. A huge thank you goes to the membership for their support. Cameron Dockter moved to accept the convention report as stated above; Kent Schweigert seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

Gelaine Orvik presented the *Dakota Coach* report. He said the goal is to have the *Dakota Coach* online by August 15, December 15, April 15, and June 15. This year we were a little late with some issues because of the preparation for hosting the National Convention. Gelaine asked the membership for any article they would like to print in the Dakota Coach.

An e-mail was sent out last year to the membership asking for them to vote on the Student Associate Membership. It was an overwhelming "YES". The NDHSCA will work to get all Universities in North Dakota on board with the student associate membership.

President-Elect Ralph Manley introduced the Vice Presidential Nominees:

John Hutchison reported on the Coach of the Year balloting. He mentioned the voting was much better this past year. e thanked the membership for taking the time to submit their vote.

John Hutchison presented the POWERade Senior Athlete of the Year report. He mentioned some of the items the NDHSCA and NDHSAA expect out of athletes when they go to accept an award. Two key items are to be dressed appropriately and also no caps.

NHSACA 3rd Vice President Randy Johnson gave a report on the National Convention. He thanked the coaches of North Dakota for their attendance. Randy told the membership the 2013 National Convention will be in Des Moines, Iowa and the 2014 National Convention is scheduled for Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

President Gregg Grinsteinner introduced Mike Sorlie, new co-chair of Lion's All-Star basketball, to the membership. He gave a report on the games that were played in Bismarck and Fargo. Things went well and the games were competitive.

Lisa Strand, Co-Chair of Optimist Volleyball, gave a report on their matches. She said things also went smoothly. She felt the best thing to do was to make sure to name plenty of alternates so if some girls decide to play basketball instead, they would still have enough players. Lisa suggested to the coaches to help select the best girls and let them choose which game to play in.

Mike Berg, Shrine Football Chair, gave a report on the football game. He talked about the recent ruling by the NCAA to not allow any All-Star contests on field a Division I School played on. He thanked Mayville State University and Fargo Shanley High School for coming up big for them. He did mention the NCAA withdrew their rule for next year, due in a large part to the leadership of Don Stauss, Kem Temple Shrine Football Leader.

Randy Johnson presented a report on the Longevity Award. This year there will be awards given for 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, and 45 years of service. The NDHSCA Executive Board decided to have the membership reply if they were in the category in order to receive the award. ceives when joining our organization. He did mention the Liability Insurance will also cover the classroom after the NDEA insurance. This is a great arrangement for our membership, and he encouraged everyone to go home and recruit new coaches to join.

Gelaine reported on the NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Fund. We currently have about \$9,000 in the account. He mentioned there would be a NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship issued next summer at the NDHSCA State Convention. The NDHSCA would work on an application form and have it on the website. The scholarship is designed for students going into coaching. Some items of consideration will be GPA, class rank, activity involvement, a letter of recommendation from a coach, and others.

Pete Moe made the recommendation from the Executive Board to nominate Gelaine Orvik as the Executive Secretary for the 2012-2013 year. President Grinsteinner asked the membership if there were any other nominations. Todd Magnuson made the motion to have nominations cease and cast a unanimous ballot for Gelaine Orvik; James Haak seconded the motion. Motion passed on a voice vote.

Pete Moe made a presentation dealing with the Coaching Permit. He said the NDHSAA passed a motion to require a Certified Coaching Permit beginning the fall of 2013 for all coaches in grades 9-12. He directed the membership to a pamphlet that was in with their registration packet **[NOTE: That brochure is also posted on the NDHSCA Website].** The NDHSAA Board wanted to be proactive with the education of coaches instead of having the State Legislature dictate what needs to occur in schools. To achieve a Coaching Permit for next year, all coaches in grades 9-12 will need to take the NFHS "Fundamentals of Coaching" Class, the NFHS "Concussion Management" Class, be certified in CPR, AED, and first aid. The permit will be good for five years and then the renewal process will begin.
