

In closing, please enjoy the rest of spring and have a wonderful summer. Hope to see you in Louisville!



NDHSCA Coaches Convention Planned



The NDHSCA Coaches Convention will be held July 26-29, 2016 at the Baymont Inn & Suites in Fargo, ND. A Room block has been reserved and will be held until July 15th with the North Dakota State rate applying. NDHSCA is making every attempt to prepare coaches for the 2016 NDHSCA Coaches Convention and the prepared curriculum for the Convention. Attendants are reminded of the special room rates at the Baymont Inn & Suites and the July 15th deadline for having the room block held for coaches. Make reservations early!

Here are some key points in preparation and registration for the Convention.

- 1. The "Permit Preparation Seminar" course work will be offered on Tuesday, July 26th. Only the NFHS Concussion Management Course will <u>not</u> be offered during the Seminar. Each registrant will need to pay an additional \$45.00 book fee and First Aid, CPR & AED Certification Card in advance with registration. If a person only needs to update their First Aid, CPR & AED Certification it will be \$10.00.
- 2. There will be four seminar tracks offered on Tuesday, "Permit Preparation Seminar", "Coaching & Conflicts", "Special Topics", and "Speed, Strength, & Nutrition". Registrants for these seminars and the convention can earn two NDSU graduate credits in the four days.
- 3. **All registration will be done on-line!** If people have a problem with the registration process, they are urged to contact their school's information technician or computer instructor.
- **4. All Athletic Directors are reminded** to have newly hired coaches prepared for Coaches Education Permit Requirements; those requirements can be satisfied by registration for the Seminar and the convention.

Register Early!

In addition to the required Coaches Education Preparation Seminar, three concurrent tracks will be offered on that date for coaches who have already completed the requirements for Coaches Education Permit. There will be some dynamic sessions. Please register early.

The NDHSCA Executive Board has decided to not have the golf scramble this year. Instead they will work to have a reduced rate for golfers to enjoy some convention golfing. The golf sessions will be held at Oxbow due to the construction at Rose Creek. Please keep your eyes peeled to the website, www.ndhsca.com, for more information.

This year we will open our Wednesday Sessions with an FCA Breakfast for all registrants. We are hoping to have a motivational speaker at this breakfast. The FCA Breakfast Session begins at 7:00 am. To determine numbers for the breakfast, registrants need to declare their attendance intent before Tuesday, 5:00 pm. Admittance will require Convention name tag and a FCA Breakfast ticket that must be picked up at the registration desk. Watch for more information regarding the FCA Activity on the NDHSCA Website. It is emphasized that FCA Breakfast is a full breakfast (not continental) menu.

After the seminar day (Tuesday), the Sport Specific Clinics will begin with sessions for basketball, football, track & field and volleyball. The other sport specific offerings will include cross-country, golf, baseball, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, and wrestling.

Another very popular activity over the past years is the Taco Bar with the "wall-horse" Races that are sponsored by Universal Athletics. Universal Athletics also sponsors these races and the Taco Bar in other states, but the North Dakota "connection" seems to attract special Universal Athletics personnel, including the Universal Athletics' President. The Universal Athletics Social will be held on Wednesday (July 27th) evening at the Fargo Baymont Inn & Suites. **Admission requires a registration name tag.**

NDHSCA will return to the traditional format for the convention with the NDHSCA Annual Meeting on Thursday morning. There will be five presentation sessions each day on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. One session in each sport will be reserved in order to review the developments and planning from each Advisory Committee.

Jared has been coaching for three years. He is responsible for all aspects of the game. This includes transportation to away contests as well as developing practice plans to improve performance. **Coach Scheeler** teaches the fundamentals while reinforcing the importance of the team game. His main focus is to develop players so they are able to contribute at the next level.

2016 Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Winners



The recipients of the annual NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship have been announced. After evaluation and assessment, the selection committee identified Aaron Sandy from Minot Bishop Ryan High School and Adrian Sevigny from Grand Forks Red River High School as beneficiaries. The Scholarships will be presented to the two young men at the NDHSCA Annual Awards Banquet, which will be held at the Fargo Baymont Convention Center on Thursday, July 28th.



The Scholarship was established in 2008 when Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. Coach Orvik is a 35-year veteran coach who has also served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association since 1974. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that the student/athlete intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for consideration for selection: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, Sat test scores, captain's and leadership roles, the application letter from the applicant, and the recommendation letters from faculty, coach and administration. Both recipients intend to coach and have enrolled at North Dakota State University.

Scholarship recipients are those who best exemplify the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values and ideals he expected from his athletes and students; and those values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

The NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship Fund has been developed by other donations from coaches, coaches' friends and sportswear companies. Extraordinary donations are made annually by coaches as they register for the Annual NDHSCA Convention and/or for Annual NDHSCA Membership. Universal Athletics has made a concerted effort to readily donate at the Annual Taco Social at the NDHSCA Convention. Some coaches have made the Scholarship Fund a recipient as a memorial for friends and relatives. SUBWAY will also make an annual \$1,000 donation for a second NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship.

This first selection of the NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship has been a learning progress for all, but a labor of love and excitement. The nomination form identified the criteria that would be used in the selection by the NDHSCA Scholarship Evaluation Committee as listed above. Other criteria for the evaluation included the necessity for the recipient to attend a North Dakota college or university and to have intention to become a high school coach.

The NDHSCA Executive Committee selected the recipients for the NDHSCA Scholarships at its recent meeting. Haley Hill, Mott-Regent HS; who plans to attend Bismarck State College; Kauri Hochhalter, Carrington HS; who plans to attend the University of North Dakota; Caleb Weisgarber, Washburn HS; who plans to attend the University of Mary; and David Youngs, Fargo South HS; who plans to attend Concordia \$500.00 will each receive College а scholarship from NDHSCA and Burger King of North Dakota.

The scholarships will be presented to each student/athlete at the Annual NDHSCA Hall of Fame and COTY Banquet at the Fargo Baymont Inn & Suites Convention Center on Thursday, July 28th. The four student-athletes collectively earned 37 athletic letters, 33 activity letters, and ACT scores averaged 26.25. Two of the recipients had a class rank in the top 7% of their respective schools.

David is the son of Victor and Melissa Youngs.



Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member the person must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
- A Lifetime Member relinquishes voting and office holding privileges if a member is no longer an active coach. If they are active in coaching, voting and office holding privileges continue.

- Seek to inculcate good health habits including the establishment of sound training rules
- Strive to develop in each athlete the qualities of leadership, initiative and good judgment
- For interscholastic competition, will dress in an appropriate manner that distinguishes the coach as a professional, representing his school and team

- Provide a safe environment for practice and competition.
- Gain an awareness of the importance of prevention, care and treatment of athletic injuries.
- Respect the integrity and judgment of the game official.
- Teach and abide by the rules of the game in letter and in spirit.
- Build and maintain ethical relationships with coaches and administrators.
- Strive for excellence in coaching skills and techniques through professional improvement.
- Promote personal fitness and good nutrition.
- Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.
- Encourage a healthy respect for the overall athletic program and its vital roles in education.
