The games in Bismarck were won by the Class B Girls with a score of 62-39 and by the Class A Boys with a score of 93-75. The games in Fargo were a bit more competitive, with the Class B Girls winning 62-57 in a nail biter, and the Class A Boys getting an overtime victory with a score of 95-85.

The 2015 Shrine Football Games were played at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks on Saturday, July 18th. The 11-man West team won the first game 16-14 over the East squad. The 9-man East team beat the East team 38-35. These were two well-played games with the athletes competing until the final horn. The week started with 126 players and 16 coaches checking into the dorm on the campus of Mayville State University. Once again, MSU was a very gracious host.
