

Here is the procedure for the other games.

- Via e-mail to ndsu.bisontickets@ndsu.edu, coaches can begin requesting their one complimentary ticket and one additional ticket to purchase beginning at 8:00 AM on the Monday of each game-week.
- Tickets are limited and orders will be filled based on ticket availability and frequency of an individual's requests.
- Tickets will be awarded and confirmations sent on the Wednesday of game-week.
- Awarded tickets can be picked up at the NDSU Ticket Office 90 minutes prior to kick-off on game-day. Per NCAA rules, no tickets can be picked up in advance of that time.

(Annual Meeting Minutes continued)

Michael Sorlie presented the Lions' All Star Basketball Report as follows:

The games were held in Bismarck on Monday, July 10th at the Bismarck Event Center. On the girls side, Class A defeated Class B by a score of 77-74. As for the boys, Class A beat Class B by a final tally of 99-82. On Tuesday, July 11th, the teams motored to Fargo to play at the Fargo Civic Center. In another tight battle on the girls side, Class A held on to the victory by a final score of 67-74. For the night cap, that Class A boys defeated the Class B boys with a final score of 109-100. There was only one major issue that had to be dealt with. A player from Devils Lake was caught with alcohol on a school trip to Costa Rica a week prior. This was not reported to us at that time. Their school contacted me on the morning of July 11th and was wondering why he was playing, as they were watching the game on BEK the previous night. After doing a lot of discussing with members of the Lion's and NDHSCA, as well as a lot of fact finding, I met with the boy after the team arrived to Fargo on Tuesday morning, and dismissed him from the team. His mom and dad came to the hotel and picked him up a few hours later. Overall, the games were competitive. I'm not sure of the attendance numbers, but there seemed to be more in Bismarck than I'm Fargo, which is typically the case due to geographical location.

Ralph Manley moved to accept the report, Carolyn Olson seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Lisa Strand presented the Optimist All-Star Volleyball Report as follows:

Fargo Shanley was the East host for the 2017 All Star Volleyball practices and 1st match. After a few changes to the original list of players, some due to choosing to play basketball and one for a rule violation, 12 East players and 12 West players reported on June 9 to the Expressway Inn & Suites in Fargo. Due to work at Fargo Shanley the first practice was held at Carl Ben Middle School with the rest of the practices at Fargo Shanley. In the evenings, the Optimists sponsored events such a Red Hawks' baseball game, an outing at Thunder Road, and a picnic. On Monday afternoon, parents and players attended an awards banquet and ceremony where the players received their participation plaques. Regan Dennis of Bismarck and Sydney Ellingson of Langdon received scholarships from the Optimists organization. Monday evening featured the East match in which the East won 3 sets to 2 (25-22, 15-25, 25-11, 20-25, 15-6). Tuesday the players traveled to Bismarck Legacy High School. This was Legacy's first time hosting the match. The West defeated the East in 3 sets (25-22, 25-20, 26-24) and as customary, to allow for more playing time for the participants, a 4th set was played (25-19). Both matches were well attended and the fans were treated to some fantastic volleyball. The defensive effort by both teams was outstanding resulting in some very long volleys. Thank you to all involved in helping to make this event successful. Thank you to the administration and volleyball coaches at each venue, as well as their supporting cast. The officials and line judges are also very much appreciated. We look forward to next summer's All-Star volleyball match. The East site on the rotation for 2018 is West Fargo Sheyenne and the West site is Bismarck Century. Dates will be corresponding for next year.

Claudia Schoellkopf moved to accept the report, Carolyn Olson seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Eric Olson gave the Shrine Football report in the absence of chair Bill Lorenz.

The 2017 Shrine Football Games were played at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks on Sunday, July 16. The 11-man East team won the first game 20-14 over the West squad. The 9-man East team beat the West team 28-27. These were two well-played games with the athletes competing until the final horn.

The week started with 125 players and 16 coaches checking into the dorm on the campus of Mayville State University. Once again, MSU was a very gracious host. The housing, dining, and practice facilities handled our large group. Everyone that was involved was very accommodating. The community of Mayville was also very welcoming by allowing us to use various facilities throughout the city. Our players used the water-park, movie theatre, and city park on different nights.

On Thursday, our athletes held a mini-camp for Shrine Hospital patients in conjunction with our media day. Everyone did an outstanding job and the athletes put smiles on all the patients' faces. The players also attended sessions about the purpose and goals of the Shrine Hospital. Hospital employee's traveled to Mayville to put on different presentations. This was an excellent opportunity for the athletes to hear about the benefits that the hospital provides. Preparations for the 2018 game have already started. The tentative date for the 2018 game has not been set, but will once again be early to mid-July. The committee is also planning on having all four teams and coaches practice at Mayville State University again. 

Are You As TOUGH As You Want Your Athletes To Be?

I am personally guilty of almost every example that I am about to point out. At one point and time, I had to

Many coaches throw the word "Toughness" around to athletes as a cl*iché. It is a buzz word. And in* many instances, those coaches were urging their athletes to be "tougher"; the coaches themselves were NOT being very tough. But we can be TOUGH. We must be TOUGH if we demand it of our athletes.

So with the help of some coaching buddies, we began a list of what makes a coach TOUGH. Not tough to play for. Not tough to deal with. But things that would be consistent with those things we demand of our athletes. This is a work in progress.

TOUGH coaches CONFRONT

It takes energy and effort to confront... a great deal of both in fact. The tough coaches never exhaust themselves of the energy needed to consistently confront and hold people accountable. When someone or something challenges the culture of their program, a tough coach stands up for what they hold true. They do it consistently and they do it tirelessly. Coaches who have toughness confront any athlete who falls below the standards they have set in their program.

If you exhaust yourself of the energy to confront, then you are "allowing things in your program" rather than "coaching them". You must have (or find) the energy every single time something challenges the fabric of your culture. If you don't, no one else will. If you do, everyone else will. When confronted with paren tal concerns, a tough coach listens and explains their view point.

TOUGH coaches are DECISION SAVVY

Tough coaches know that making the hard decision is what separates the good from the great. Head Coaches make hundreds of decisions a week concerning every aspect of their program. They don't delegate the difficult ones down the chain of command. They make them and then they stand behind them.

Experience has taught them how to make them with the best interest of the team AND the best interest of the athlete all at the same time. More often than not, it's the coach who struggles the most with these decisions. They feel the weight of deciding something that impacts so many people in so many ways. It can be paralyzing. It can be overwhelming. Many coaches confide that this responsibility has led to burnout and can ultimately drive you from the profession all together if you don't develop toughness.

Avoidance of decision making is even worse than making the wrong decision in many instances. The toughest of the tough actually embrace it. It's these coaches who make the proper decision more often than not.

TOUGH coaches expect mistakes, but don't accept Excuses

TOUGH coaches know their athletes are going to make mistakes. They know they are going to fail from time to time. They know this because they know they are going to put them in situations to fail. They are going to create scenarios designed to push them beyond their comfort zones. TOUGH coaches know mistakes lead to improvement. They teach through lessons.

Wayne Gretzky routinely tripped over his own skates because he pushed himself to go harder in drills than his coaches demanded. While the TOUGH coaches expect these mistakes, they do NOT accept excuses for them. They deal with excuses swiftly and severely. Tough coaches know the difference between a reason and an excuse. Tough coaches use mistakes to help a person grow. Tough coaches teach without the person even knowing they are being taught.

TOUGH coaches understand **NEXT** PLAY Mentality

Do we move on or do we replay every mistake in the next timeout, then at half time, then in postgame, then the next day in film room, then the next 10 times it happens? Do we hold grudges when dealing with discipline issues?

If you do, then take NEXT PLAY out of your coaching vocabulary. Obviously there are aspects of our job and this profession that accumulation of actions must warrant consequences, but if you want athletes to move on to the Next Play, you had better coach this way.

TOUGH coaches actions are aligned with standards

"Do as I say, not as I do" mentality is dead to the iY Generation of athletes today. When presented with a situation that conflicts between what they see you do and what they hear you say, 99.999999% of the time they will believe what they see.

The alignment you have in your program between TALK/ACTIONS will be directly proportional to how your athletes balance their TALK/ACTIONS. When a coach demands something of a program or someone in it that is out of alignment with a coach's actions, frustration sets in quickly. That will turn to disengagement and total withdrawal the moment adversity hits. A TOUGH coach has alignment in this area. Athletes, fans, and administrators believe what they see more than what they hear. If you want a "TOUGHNESS" in your program your actions better be worth watching.

TOUGH coaches take no credit for wins and deflect blame in loss.

TOUGH coaches don't need pats on the back after a win. My dad always said," If you want **someone to** clap for you, be a musician or a magician... don't be a coach."

Coaches with toughness recognize the efforts of their athletes and their team in victory. In defeat, they deflect the blame from those same people. You don't have to be that coach that takes total blame every game. That grows old fast too and simply isn't believable. It may also be out of alignment with your program's culture on truth and honesty. You can be honest and truthful in private...not in public.

TOUGH coaches never allow anyone outside their program to attack someone within it. The best way to do this at times is actually another sign of TOUGHNESS...give the other team the credit for the victory.

The TOUGHEST coaches learn to balance these situations. They learn to use these situations to their advantage. When coaches do this, their athletes will do the same.

If you have this ingrained in your team culture, it will be obvious that in public each member has each other's back. It will allow them to deal with adversity in private and keep team issues within the locker room. We have all seen great teams derailed by team issues that become public.

Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member the person must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
- A Lifetime Member relinquishes voting and office holding privileges if a member is no longer an active coach. If they are active in coaching, voting and office holding privileges continue.









NEW CAMP INSURANCE REQUIREMENT: PARTICIPANT/ACCIDENT COVERAGE

As a member benefit of your coaches association, your members will continue to have General Liability coverage for their coaching activities (for example, State Association sanctioned All-Star Events, camps, other coaching activities and classroom coverage). The new requirement from the General Liability Company is that if a coach operates/conducts a camp he/she must have Participant/Accident coverage for all participants/campers attending the camp. Your member coach has the option to provide proof of existing Participant/Accident coverage or to purchase the coverage at a discounted rate through the NOCAD Camp Insurance Program.

WHY THE CHANGE?

When a coach is coaching at his/her school, student athletes are always covered by an Accident Insurance Policy that is provided by the school or the High School Association. The coverage is in place to help schools and High School Associations eliminate potential litigation; because when someone is injured, the Participant/Accident Insurance Policy can pay medical bills.

Even if the injured party has Primary Medical Insurance, most policies no longer pay 100% of the medical bills and parents could have high out-of- "#O" h

Medical Insurance Policy has an 80/20 co-pay, the insurance company is going to pay \$40,000 and the parents would have \$10,000 in out-of-pocket expenses.
