

Dean has also been a nominee for the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Coach of the Year. He served six-years on the Boys' Basketball Advisory Board. Coach Winczewski has acquired a 276-134 win-loss record in basketball. His teams have won five State Titles.

He has also coached football, girls' basketball and track and field. Dean and his wife Jackie have three children: Andrew, Aric and Alex.



Ron Metz is a graduate of Carson High School and Dickinson State University. Coach Metz is a 30-year coaching veteran. 
Coach Metz has also coached boys' basketball, football and track and field. Ron and his wife Jill have two children: Rani and RiAnne.



2018 Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Recipients

The recipients of the annual NDHSCA - Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship have been identified and notified. After evaluation and assessment, the selection committee selected *Raquel Doll* from Hazen High School and *Kaitlyn Schiele* from Edgeley High School as beneficiaries. The Scholarships will be presented to the two young ladies at the NDHSCA Annual Awards Banquet, which will be held at the Fargo Ramada Convention Center on Thursday, July 26th.

The Scholarship was established in 2008 when Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. Coach Orvik is a 35-year veteran coach who has also served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association from 1974-2015. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that the student/athlete intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for consideration for selection: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, captain's and leadership roles, an application letter from the applicant, and recommendation letters from faculty, coach and

administration. The recipients also best exemplify the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values and ideals he expected from his athletes and students; and those values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

The NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship Fund has been developed by other donations from coaches, coaches' friends and sportswear companies. Extraordinary donations are made annually by coaches as they register for the Annual NDHSCA Convention and/or for Annual NDHSCA Membership. Universal Athletics has made a concerted effort to readily donate at the Annual Taco Social at the NDHSCA Convention. Some coaches have made the Scholarship Fund a recipient as a memorial for friends and relatives. SUBWAY will also make an annual \$1,000 donation for a **second NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship**.





NEW CAMP INSURANCE REQUIREMENT: PARTICIPANT/ACCIDENT COVERAGE

As a member benefit of your coaches' association, your members will continue to have General Liability coverage for their coaching activities (for example, State Association sanctioned All-Star Events, camps, other coaching activities and classroom coverage). The new requirement from the General Liability Company is that if a coach operates/conducts a camp he/she must have Participant/Accident coverage for all participants/campers attending the camp. Your member coach has the option to provide proof of existing Participant/Accident coverage or to purchase the coverage at a discounted rate through the NOCAD Camp Insurance Program.

WHY THE CHANGE?

When a coach is coaching at his/her school, student athletes are always covered by an Accident Insurance Policy that is provided by the school or the High School Association. The coverage is in place to help schools and High School Associations eliminate potential litigation; because when someone is injured, the Participant/Accident Insurance Policy can pay medical bills. Even if the injured party has Primary Medical Insurance, most policies no longer pay 100% of the medical bills and parents could have high out-of-pocket expenses. For example, if a student has a \$50,000 ACL injury and the parents' Primary Medical Insurance Policy has an 80/20 co-pay, the insurance company is going to pay \$40,000 and the parents would have \$10,000 in out-of-pocket expenses.

In today's legal climate, everything possible must be done to protect our General Liability Policy from lawsuits being filed for negligent acts when someone is injured. Camp Liability Policies could be unavailable in the near future if Participant/Accident coverage has not been added.
