Coaching Tidbits

I was able to attend both the National and State Coaches Convention this summer, and again I am amazed at the accomplishments by our coaches of North Dakota. Congratulations to Coach Rob Jacobson of Fargo Davies who was named National Assistant Coach of the Year, along with Coach Gary Schauer of Ashley & Coach Dan Carr of Linton who were both inducted into the NHSACA Hall of Fame. At the state convention, we had 4 coaches inducted to the State Hall of Fame: Brian Anderson of New Town, Clint Chamberlin of Williston, Gregg Grinsteinner of Dickinson Trinity, & Randy Johnson of Hazen. All of these people, along with the others who were recognized during the banquet, should be commended for their dedication to our profession. Not only should they be singled out for their individual accomplishments, but we also need to give a big shout out to the families of these coaches, who make plenty of sacrifices along the way. I had a college friend reach out to me for advice after recently accepting a Head Coaching job. First off, I was excited to get a good, quality person involved in coaching, and second, I was floored that I am now the one offering advice to a less seasoned coach. It feels like yesterday that I was that young coach seeking out knowledge from more experienced coaches. I'd like to share a few tidbits that I feel younger coaches could possibly use in their first years.

- Many kids don't love the sport as much as we do; they are involved in sports to be active, be around friends, etc. They like to win, but it's not the end of the world if they don't. It took me a while to figure this out and it is still hard to accept at times, but many kids are out purely for the fun of it. Imagine that!
- Delegate responsibility amongst your assistant coaches and make sure they have ownership in the program. You may not always agree on everything but listen to them as they often see things from a different viewpoint then you do. Also, make sure you show appreciation towards your assistants. They put in many hours away from their family as well, and if you have good assistants, they can make your workload much easier.
- Work hard to keep a healthy balance of coaching your sport, family, job, and faith. Make sure you make time for yourself and your family. It's easy to get swallowed up in all the tasks it takes to be a coach but set aside some time to get your mind away from your tasks at hand. This also goes for your student-athletes as well. It's ok to give them some time away from their sport to be a teenager.
- I sat next to a long time coach during the NHSACA Convention, and he shared one piece of advice with me: "Above all else, make sure your athletes know that you love them and care for them." This quote resonated with me and exemplified why we do what we do.

I wish all of you the best of luck in the 2018-2019 season. Sometimes as a coach, things can get overwhelming and your mind may be spinning, but all you can be sure of is that your next decision is your best decision you make. Very few teams and coaches can be standing as champions at the conclusion of the season, but if we work hard to teach our student athletes how to be young adults, we'll end up with many more victories than what will be shown in the standings. ——Eric Olson

NDHSCA ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING

July 26, 2018; 10:50 AM Fargo Ramada Woodland North MINUTES

President Olson called the meeting to order at 10:55 am.

Ralph Manley moved to approve the minutes from the 2017 July Annual Meeting, Mike Mayer seconded the motion. Motion passed without any dissenting voice vote.

Executive Secretary Randy Johnson presented the Financial Report as of June 30, 2018. The NDHSCA Fiscal Year runs from July 1 to June 30.

\$ 98.83 – FPSFCU Primary Shares Account Balance June 30, 2018

\$ 9,605.24 - FPSFCU Checking Account June 30, 2018

\$22,133.91 - FPSFCU Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Account Balance June 30, 2018

\$58,993.36 - FPSFCU Money Market Share Balance June 30, 2018

\$90,831.34 - FPSFCU Total Cash on Hand June 30, 2018

Total cash on hand on June 30, 2017 was \$76,787.34. There is outstanding income from the NDHSAA Convention support, Lions All-Star Basketball, and the second installment from Subway. Lyall Krueger moved to accept the financial report, Ralph Manley seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Randy Johnson gave a 2018 NDHSCA Convention report. As of 5:00 July 26 there were 339 registered for convention, 31 registered for one credit, 50 registered for two credits, and 384 signed up for membership at this time. Michael Sorlie moved to accept the report, Cameron Dockter seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Lisa Strand gave a report on the Dakota Coach. Things are going well. If anyone has some articles of interest, please send them her way. We are trying to include more pictures and items dealing with the NDHSCA. Mitch Grochow moved to accept the report, Ralph Manley seconded the motion. Motion passed without any dissenting voice vote.

Randy Johnson gave a 2017-2018 membership report. There were 1,300 paid members, 156 lifetime members and 4 new lifetime members. Membership was up this past year and hope it continues to grow. Mike Hendrickson moved to accept the report, Greg Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed without any dissenting voice vote.

(Annual Meeting Minutes continued)

President-Elect Tracey Heisler introduced the two Vice President candidates. They are Dean Winczewski from Minot High School and Ron Metz from Bismarck Century High School. The final time for voting will be today at 1:00 session. The recipient of the Vice President position will be announced at this evenings Hall of Fame/Coach of the Year Banquet.

President-Elect Tracey Heisler and Executive Secretary Randy Johnson discussed the two By-Law changes. The first change was the wording for associate membership. Discussion was held. The By-Law was stated as "Associate Membership shall include college and university coaches, AAU coaches, other amateur level coaches, cheerleading advisors, sports writers, sports announcers, athletic trainers, or other professionals engaged in athletics in some way other than coaching." Dave Dougherty moved to accept this By-Law change, Greg Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed without any dissenting voice vote.

President-Elect Tracey Heisler and Executive Secretary Randy Johnson discussed the other By-Law change for Lifetime Members. It is proposed to read now as "Lifetime Memberships may be purchased for a one-time fee. Such Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including voting at the State Convention. If a member is no longer an active coach, the Lifetime Member relinquishes office holding privileges and association liability insurance benefit. A Lifetime Member must have been: A) an NDHSCA Member for at least 20 years, and B) an active high school coach for at least 25 years, either in North Dakota or in another state." Tracey Heisler moved we accept this By-Law change as written, Kasey Grochow seconded the motion. Motion passed without any dissenting voice vote.

Assistant Executive Secretary Scott Grochow presented information about the POWERade Senior Athlete of the Year and NDHSCA Coach of the Year balloting. He discussed the new voting procedure using Survey Monkey and how well it is going. Scott mentioned the importance of writing letters to POWERade thanking them for the Senior Athlete Award. This is a huge help in gaining the sponsorship every year.


