Roles in Coaching Athletes

Message from President Tracey Heisler



Congrats to all for surviving brutal weather this winter and spring! This last year is the prime example of how creative, flexible, and diligent our North Dakota coaches are. We had to find places to practice, negotiate multiple schedule changes, organize transportation—all at the mercy of Mother Nature.

I would guess most of the general public has no idea of how challenging the role of a coach really is. What they see is the coach in action at the competition which is just the “tip of the iceberg”—even smaller than the three foot high glacier which covered the south end of Cushman Field in mid-April . . . (another story for another time!)

Just as the work load outside of the classroom has greatly increased in the last decade, so has that work load for coaches. Because of the changes in culture, society, expectations, and technology, the amount of administrative duties has risen exponentially in the last ten years. These requirements can become so overwhelming that the art of working with kids becomes secondary.

As coaches, yes, we have to do those duties, and many other roles, that are not remotely along the lines with “coaching athletes,” so we must remember that we coach for kids.

I often think that what people see as “coaching” looks much more glamorous than the reality. I also find young/ new coaches become overwhelmed by all the extra behind the scenes requirements, and the even more draining anxiety, tension, and emotional strain that comes with coaching. Veteran coaches, I challenge you to reach out to those young people and help them to find balance. Young coaches, reach out to those veteran coaches for advice. We need to keep good people in this profession.

I believe that coaches learn best from their peers. With that I encourage all of you to attend our state convention this summer. This year you will not only have the chance to learn from some of North Dakota’s best but also the best in the nation. Not often are we given this opportunity in our own back yard.

I was greatly humbled last summer at the National Convention when hearing from the candidates for National Coach of the Year. These people are not only amazing technicians and strategists but also amazing human beings. To learn from them and be inspired by them is one of the greatest opportunities in my coaching career.

I hope everyone has a chance to regroup, re-energize, and rewind over the summer. Enjoy the warmth our summer weather brings because the cold will be back—sooner than we want and lasting longer than we want. . . (track coach issues!)

The recipients of the annual NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarships have been identified and notified. After evaluation and assessment, the selection committee selected **Maria Blessum** from Rugby High School and **Isaac Huber** from Edgeley High School as beneficiaries. The Scholarship was established in 2008 when Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that the student/athlete intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for consideration for selection: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, captain's and leadership roles, an application letter from the applicant, and recommendation letters from faculty, coach and administration. The recipient also best exemplifies the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values and ideals he expected from his athletes and students; and those same values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

The NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship Fund has been developed by other donations from coaches, coaches' friends and sportswear companies. Extraordinary donations are made annually by coaches as they register for the Annual NDHSCA Convention and/or for Annual NDHSCA Membership. Universal Athletics has made a concerted effort to readily donate at the Annual Taco Social at the NDHSCA Convention. Some coaches have made the Scholarship Fund a recipient as a memorial for friends and relatives. SUBWAY also makes an annual \$1,000 donation for a **second NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship**.

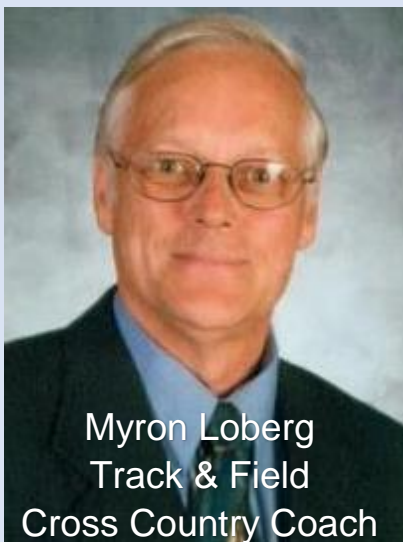

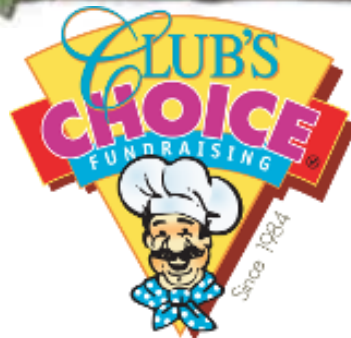
