Memorial Day...Remembrance Day... Thanksgiving Day

This Memorial Day (originally called Decoration Day when it was first held at Arlington Cemetery on May 30th, 1868) I made my usual round trip to about 5 cemeteries in the area. It is about a 100-mile round trip in which I make it to many of my family's gravesites. I have family that fought in World War I, World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. I even learned this year that my great grandmother died in childbirth during the 1918 pandemic after contracting the Spanish Flu. Of course, I have family members who were buried a lot farther away in sites that I am not able to visit but still cherish. What a heritage!

I truly look forward to this day every year. It is spring and everything is fresh. It is a special day in which I get to stop and think of all the precious people that have gone before. There are specials on television and war movies all over the place. There are segments in the news like "a life well lived" that has veterans who tell their stories with such pride and humility. We lose many of these veterans every year and it is good that we pay our respects for all they have done so that we can enjoy the freedoms that we have. We think of all the things that so many of these people never had because of the sacrifices they made so that we could enjoy them. Eric posted a tweet last week that contained an inspiring quote from General George Patton that read "It is foolish and wrong to mourn the men who died. Rather we should thank God such men lived." What a heritage!

Memorial Day has kind of evolved into a day we honor all the special people that have gone before us, not just military personnel. Maybe it is Remembrance Day. After all, we put flowers at the sites of many of our special people who were not in the military. We lose more special people each day and Covid – 19 has amplified that. I get many messages each year of members of our Coaches Associations that have passed away. I remember sitting down at the Hall of Fame Banquet at one of our National Conventions. Across the table from me was a cowboy and his wife, they were the nicest people. As we talked, I learned that he was up for the Hall of Fame. He had been coaching football for fifty years. Not only that, he had also coached two other sports for fifty years and to top it off he was going back to coach that fall. We have hundreds of stories like this across our country. These people were all great leaders. What a heritage!

So maybe it is Thanksgiving Day, because of how thankful we are to have great leaders, in our lives. I am also thankful for the great leaders our National Association and our North Dakota High School Coaches Association have. At the National Level we have our Executive Director Dave Doughtery and President Ted Schroeder along with Darin Boysen the Executive Director of the Nebraska Coaches Association who is also our State Executive Director Representative on the National Board. In North Dakota we have our Executive Director Randy Johnson and his staff. These people have put in a tremendous amount of work behind the scenes to put on a convention and carry out the day to day activities of our associations. Our All-Star Chairs work long hard hours to put together the All-Star Games. And yet, after all that work, they agreed to postpone the National Convention and cancel the Nebraska Coaches Convention and all their All-Star Games. In North Dakota, we have also cancelled our All-Star Games and in hopes of minimizing risk, moved the convention to Mandan. All these changes have wiped out hours of work and added countless more. These are not easy decisions, but they were made in the interest of protecting our heritage. Who knows if we went in the correct direction? All we can say is that a man who walks with God is always moving in the right direction.

Life's Lessons for Athletes & Coaches

Greetings fellow coaches and readers. I sit here contemplating what has transpired in the last few months, losing a season of coaching, lost opportunities for athletes, and life changes in general. I decided to share some random thoughts.

I am reminded of all the things we do as coaches, most of the time we don't have time to reflect on all that we do. It is more than getting your athletes and teams to achieve at a high level and to perform to the best of their abilities. It is the lessons for life that are the most important.

This was a very long spring with challenges that we have never had to experience before. However, I would like to share some of the lessons that go along with coaching that may help all of us get through this time together.

Here are some of the lessons that I tell our kids we must learn if we are going to be successful in our sport and to use these lessons to be successful in life.

- -The first lesson is survival, live to fight another day. Our health is the number one priority, as I tell my athletes you can't compete if you are injured or sick, so health comes first.
- -Control what we can control and work to minimize our weaknesses to keep improving. Stay positive, turn what seems negative into positive motivation.
- -Deal with adversity and disappointment together. We are not in this alone.
- -Find a way to self-motivate. When you learn to do things on your own, the rewards you get will be much greater than if you do it because you were told to do it.
- -Don't be afraid to make mistakes, because we can learn from them. Any time we learn something we can continue to move forward. It is not the mistake that is the problem, but the problem may be the response to the mistake.
- -I am a teacher, but we all need to keep learning, both my athletes and me so we can keep moving forward.

The last thing we do in our programs, regardless of the sport, is to end practice or a game with the following questions. Did we do something today that will make us better? Can you go home and look in the mirror and say, that was as good as I could do today? If you can say yes you are fine but remember not every day will be a picnic.

I would like to commend all of you for great job you are doing and will continue to do for kids of our state. I believe North Dakota coaches are second to none, and you are so important to the lives of all of our kids.

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Summer Coaches Convention beginning Monday, July 27 through Thursday, July 30 has been moved to Mandan. Rooms have been reserved for this convention at the Baymont Convention Center. Please call 701-663-7401 to reserve your room(s) today.

Registration for the convention is open. All coaches will need to register through the NDHSCA website: www.ndhsca.com. Here are some key points about this summer's convention.

- 1. The Convention site has been moved to Mandan due to Covid-19 restrictions & concerns.
- 2. Convention registration is **\$65.00 & m**embership remains at **\$60.00** for a **total of \$125**. One needs to be a member to attend the convention.
- 3. Convention to be held at the Baymont in Mandan.
- 4. Dates of the convention are July 27 through July 30, 2020.
- 5. Up to **two semester hours of credit** available through NDSU.
 - a. Cost is \$65.00 per credit
 - b. A person may take one or two credits

Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Recipients

The recipients of the annual NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship have been identified and notified for 2020. After evaluation and assessment, the selection committee selected **Taylor Dean** from Stanley High School and **Skyler Strand** from Bismarck High School as beneficiaries. The Scholarships will be presented to the two young student/athletes at the NDHSCA Annual Awards Banquet, which will be held at the Mandan Baymont Convention Center on Thursday, July 30th.

The Scholarship was established in 2008 when Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. Coach Orvik is a 35-year veteran coach who also served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association from 1974-2015. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that he/she intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for consideration for selection: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, captain's and leadership roles, an application letter from the applicant, and recommendation letters from faculty, coach and administration. The recipients also best exemplifies the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values and ideals he expected from his athletes and students; and those same values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

The NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship Fund has been developed by donations from coaches, coaches' friends and sportswear companies. Extraordinary donations are made annually by coaches as they register for the Annual NDHSCA Convention and/or for Annual NDHSCA Membership. Universal Athletics has made a concerted effort to readily donate at the Annual Taco Social at the NDHSCA Convention. Some coaches have made the Scholarship Fund a recipient as a memorial for friends and relatives. **SUBWAY** also makes an annual \$1,000 donation for a **second NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship**.



Taylor Dean is ranked first in her class of 42 at Stanley High School. She will have earned more than 29 credits when she graduates; she has an ACT test composite of 29 and earned a GPA of 4.00 through seven semesters. Her academic classes include College Credit Classes in calculus, college composition 1 and college speech. Her GPA reflects her college credit classes as well as human anatomy.

Taylor lettered in cross-country as a ninth grader, in track & field as a 10th and 11th grader, and in volleyball, basketball, and softball for her four years in high school (although her senior year of softball was eliminated due to Coronavirus). She was a member of FBLA and S-Club for four years and participated in band for two years and Academic Olympics for two years Taylor had also served as a team captain in basketball (three years),

volleyball as a senior and in softball as a junior.

Taylor was nominated for this scholarship by her basketball and track & field coach, Kelly Roemmich. Kelly was also her math instructor. He praised her scholastically "as a math student . . . who worked hard at completing assignments accurately and in a timely fashion." Kelly added that "Taylor was also a very respectful student and would never be a disruption in class."

Alecia Pulver additionally declares Taylor Dean as being a respectful student who enjoys a healthy relationship with her peers and adults. She is a positive role model for younger students. Taylor never avoids a challenge and is committed to perseverance and success. In basketball Kelly alluded to her time and effort to improve in the sport. Although she may not have been the fastest athlete, she made up by hustling. Taylor had a superlative work ethic and was the epitome of a student-athlete. Coach Roemmich asserts that Taylor isn't "an in your face leader", but she leads by example and always congratulates teammates when they perform well.

Overall, Taylor's recommendations center on her academics, commitment, work-ethic, dedication and positivity. She is a great leader and student-athlete with a commitment to be a true team person, all of which qualify her as a deserving recipient of the NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship.



Skyler Strand will graduate ranked first in his class of 282 in a Weighted Class Rank with an ACT test composite score of 27. He had a Weighted GPA of 4.05 with a curriculum that included AP government, AP psychology, AP US History, AP biology and Blended English 12.

Skyler competed and lettered in hockey and baseball for the four years he attended Bismarck High School. He was a leader and/or a captain in baseball as a junior and hockey as a senior. He was elected to be the team captain as a senior, but of course the season has been curtailed by the coronavirus pandemic.

Skyler was a member of Student Council for three years and senior class president. He was a member of DECA as a 9th grader and prom

committee as a junior. He was a member of HOSA for three years and National Honor Society his final three years at Bismarck High School. Skyler also served two terms on the State Superintendent's Student Cabinet.

Skyler shared that he wanted to become a high school coach because coaches influence athletes and their life decisions. Student-athletes are such vulnerable people as they strive for success. Coaches also serve as positive role-models and as inspirations in how to lead, overcome adversity and be a part of a team. Coaches are constantly imparting leadership skills that influence athletes for their lifetime.

Skyler is praised by his baseball coach who has known Skyler as a student, player and co-worker. Coach Carr says "Skyler is a hard worker in everything he does." Carr adds that Skyler's "...positive attitude brightens any environment he is in and makes working with him a positive experience." During Skyler's senior hockey season, he endured a season ending injury. Coach shared, "True to Skyler's form, he turned lemons into lemonade by becoming a student assistant coach....because of Skyler's personality, work ethic, and motivation our team had a remarkable successful season."

His Coachability and sportsmanship are both top-notch. He has provided vocal support and is a great role model for the other players on the team, with his calm, collected, analytical nature."

Skyler receives complementary accolades from the Bismarck High School Athletic Director. Scot Nustad compliments Skyler "...with being diligent, intelligent and pleasant. Nustad ads "Skyler is enthusiastic, thorough...and demanding of the best from himself." Nustad's final remark is that "Skyler will be a great ambassador for the NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik –NDHSCA Scholarship's values and commitment to the youth of North Dakota."

Undoubtedly Skyler's recommendations center on his academics, leadership, dedication, motivation, responsibility and reliability. His high school preparation, outstanding character and his vision for himself to be a leader of student-athletes make him a deserving recipient of the NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship.






Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member one must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
- A Lifetime Member relinquishes voting and office holding privileges if a member is no longer an active coach. If they are active in coaching, voting and office holding privileges continue.
