Into The Light

Greetings from the NDHSCA,

Have you ever traveled through a long tunnel? I have walked through some. We took a family trip to Mammoth Cave National Park in conjunction with the NHSACA Convention in Louisville. I have driven through some long ones in cities and national parks and have traveled on trains through others. Even the subway under the river in Washington DC was an adventure. They seem long and there is no natural light. When you are down in a cave and they shut off all the lights it is really black, but when you come out of the tunnel you really enjoy the light. I know there are still problems, but it feels as though we are coming out of the Corona tunnel and into the light again... and it feels good!

Over half of our country is now fully vaccinated and it is about time because we are also suffering from Corona Virus fatigue. The Corona Virus has been a serious concern. It brought to light issues I had not even realized. There was a report the other day saying that eating disorders amongst our youth had more than doubled during our shutdown. A report from CNBC said that there was a two million percent growth rate in health and fitness during the pandemic and that gardening and revamping of our living spaces had a one hundred and forty percent increase. On the Project Play website, an Aspen Institute Survey said that the pandemic accelerated trends toward at-home, virtual training. But after an initial rush online, the amount of time spent on such training has increased only seven percent since the shutdown. Dr. Rob Bell a sports psychologist in the same article says that the way athletes cope with life is through their sport. If sport is okay and we are performing well, then life more easily works itself out. It is when we have severe on-the-field and off-the-field issues that cause our stress levels and anxiety to spike. Dr. Bell says that athletes are creatures of habit and crave structure and discipline. So, practice self-care. Keep consistent sleep schedules. Continue exercising. Eat well and stay hydrated. Maintaining structure to stay healthy will help avoid athletes going on huge binges of screen time or eating unhealthily. Thank goodness we are back!

I have been scanning our website again. I try to do that once in a while to remind myself of the fundamentals in our association. I also like to remind myself of the points in the Code of Athletics and Coaches Code of Conduct. There is a lot of information extending from the membership list to nomination forms, and reasons that everyone should obtain camp insurance. After all, one of those points is that we should fulfill responsibilities to provide health services and an environment free of safety hazards. A second point is that we should demonstrate mastery of and continuing interest in coaching principles and techniques through professional improvement. One more point is we should promote ethical relationships among coaches.

Wow, those few principles are a whole mandate in themselves. How are we supposed to do all that? Isn't it awesome that most of these things can be taken care of at the annual coaches' convention that your association provides for you? I am very excited; it has been two years since the last one. One of my greatest disappointments is being the only person to be president who had to cancel a convention.



NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik Scholarship Recipients Selected

The recipients of the annual NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship have been identified and notified for 2021. After evaluation and assessment, the selection committee selected **Truman Werremeyer** from Fargo Davies High School and **Megan Zimmer** from Kenmare High School as beneficiaries. The Scholarships will be presented to the two young student/athletes at the NDHSCA Annual Awards Banquet, which will be held at the Fargo Ramada Convention Center on Thursday, July 22nd.

The Scholarship was established in 2008 when Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. Coach Orvik is a 35-year veteran coach who also served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association from 1974-2015. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that he/she intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for consideration for selection: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, captains' and leadership roles, an application letter, and recommendation letters from faculty, coach and administration. The recipients also best exemplify the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values and ideals he expected from his athletes, students and those values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

Truman Werremeyer

Truman Werremeyer is ranked 20th in his class of 320 at Fargo Davies High School. He will have earned more than 24.5 credits when

when he graduates; he has an ACT test composite of 33 and earned a GPA of 4.188 through seven semesters. Truman has earned credits in advanced classes that includes AP Chemistry, AP statistics, AP US History, AP Biology, Pre-Calculus, and AP European History, and College Trigonometry.



Truman participated in three sports (football, wrestling and baseball) each year in grades 9-12. He was also a member of the Davies HS wrestling team as a 7th & 8th grader. He earned a total of 15 letters at Davies High School. Truman was a captain in all three sports as a senior, and in addition, a wrestling team captain as a junior. In addition, he participated in his church youth activities, FCA, and as a volunteer youth wrestling coach.

Truman was nominated for this scholarship by his wrestling coach, Kevin Spiess. Kevin alerted the Evaluation Committee with his opening statement that "Truman is a tremendous athlete but is also very humble." Spiess also notes that Truman is identified by faculty and staff to be a "quiet" state wrestling champion and NDSU football commit. He works quietly in youth wrestling and youth football with "an incredible level of patience and heart of a teacher."

Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member one must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
- A Lifetime Member relinquishes voting and office holding privileges if a member is no longer an active coach. If they are active in coaching, voting and office holding privileges continue.
