

Lessons Learned From Geese

Maybe it is human nature.... In a philosophy class one time we were asked if people are basically good or if people are basically bad. The conclusion was put to us this way. Do you have to teach a kid to be bad or to be good? It seems that we always think of the negative first. I do it too. "Those darn kids in my classes I wish they would study more. I wish my athletes would have put more time in the weight room this summer because we would have been much stronger."

However, the majority of my students **do** work hard and most of my athletes **do** put in the time over the summer. But, for some reason all those negatives stick in our mind. Maybe...... there were a lot of good things that happened in 2020, after all I heard that there is a small baby boom going on! Hey, job security.

Have you ever heard of the Barnum Effect? It is named after circus promoter P.T. Barnum, who said that a good circus had to have something in it for everyone. The term is often used when talking about astrology because there is something written into every horoscope to make it seem as if it applies to you.

I am from Kenmare as most of you know and you may also know that our school mascot is the "Honker". I am proud of that because we live on the edge of a refuge in which millions of geese pass through each year. It is obvious to me that our school mascot applies to the area we live in. However, it definitely has some drawbacks. Trying to find the good in everything, we try to use it to our advantage. One of the things that we talk about are the lessons that can be learned from geese. Hopefully, there is a little Barnum Effect in it for you.

- As each goose flaps it wings, it creates an uplift for others behind it. There is 71% more flying range in a V-formation than flying alone.
 Lesson: Athletes who share a common direction and sense of purpose can get there more quickly. Flying in V-formation increases visibility and allows everyone to see the goals.
- 2. Whenever a goose flies out of formation, it feels the drag and tries to get back into position. Lesson: It's harder to do something alone than it is together.
- 3. When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back into formation and another goose flies at the head. Lesson: Shared leadership and interdependence give each of us a chance to lead as well as an opportunity to rest.
- 4. The geese in the rear of the formation "Honk" to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. Lesson: Encouragement is motivating. We need to make sure our "Honking" is encouraging Not discouraging.
- 5. When a goose gets sick or wounded and falls, two geese fall out of formation and stay with it until it revives or dies. Then they catch up or join another flock.

 Lesson: We all need help from time to time. We should stand by our teammates in difficult times.

I hope you have an awesome 2021 while trying to focus on all the positives in it. I know that your coach's association will be doing everything in its power to make it one of the best. Happy New Year!

As we go through our respective seasons, we work hard to prepare our athletes for each competition. This gives each athlete the best advantage for their individual performance within the team concept we are trying to institute. As the seasons come to an end, we have given our athletes, especially our seniors, the best opportunities for success. This is what we do to reward them for all their years of dedication to our programs. We have the opportunity to nominate them for the senior athlete of the year. They are nominated because they meet all the qualifications of a student athlete who is nominated. Not just because they are a senior in our program. When we have the data to match our decisions those questions are put to rest and we can move on without question or debate. Let's make sure we continuously follow our professional ethics and set guidelines when making these decisions.

Finally, a couple of reminders. Please encourage membership in our great coaches' association and nominate your assistant coaches as well as junior high coaches for post season coaching awards. Also, plan for the summer coaches' convention, July $19^{th} - 22^{nd}$ at the Fargo Ramada Inn. As well as the National Convention in Lincoln NE, July $26^{th} - 29^{th}$. 

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association has made nominations for balloting for the Association's Vice President. The balloting will be conducted at the Annual Coaches Convention held this summer at the Fargo Ramada July 19 through July 22.

The two candidates will be Jamie Zastoupil, currently the Head Volleyball Coach at Bismarck Century High School and Claudia Schoellkopf, currently the Head Girls' and Boys' Swimming and Diving Coach at Mandan High School.

Jamie Zastoupil is a graduate of North Dakota State University and St. Catherine University. Coach Zastoupil is a 15-year coaching veteran. She has been the Head Volleyball Coach at Bismarck Century High School the last 10 years. Jamie has a career coaching record of 313 wins with only 34 losses. Coach Zastoupil has won six State Volleyball Championships in her 10 years as the Head Volleyball Coach. She was named the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Subway State Coach of the Year once in 2020 and West Region Volleyball Coach of the Year three times. Coach Zastoupil has served the North Dakota Volleyball Coaches as an Advisory Member for two years. She is a Physical Education teacher at Bismarck Century High School and is a member of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association and North Dakota SHAPE.

Jamie and her husband Neal have three children: Gravsen, Zoey and Ryer.

Claudia Schoellkopf is a graduate of North Dakota State University and Minot State University. Coach Schoellkopf is a 24-year coaching veteran. She has been the Head Girls' and Boys' Swimming and Diving Coach at Mandan for one year. Claudia has a coaching record of 178 wins and 168 losses in girls' swimming while accomplishing 184 wins, 119 losses and one tie in boys' swimming. Coach Schoellkopf has won one State Girls' Swimming and Diving Team Titles, coached three Girls' State Diving Champions and 7 Boys' State Diving Champions in her career. She was named the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Winter Assistant Coach of the Year in 2014, North Dakota High School Coaches Association Fall Assistant Coach of the Year in 2019 and was named a finalist for the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Boys' Assistant Coach of the Year in 2015 and 2018. Claudia has been a clinician at the North Dakota High School Coaches Association State Convention four times and the National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Convention twice. She is a swimming teacher at Mandan High School.



The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Executive Committee voted unanimously at the Fall Meeting to induct two coaches into the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Tim Delmore has been coaching for 44 years at Grand Forks Red River High School. His coaching career includes eight years as a Head Boys' Basketball Coach, 14 years as an Assistant Boys Basketball Coach and 44 years as an Assistant Girls' Track and Field Coach. Coach Delmore's Boys' Basketball teams won 102 games. His Girls' Track and Field Teams won four State Championships, two State Runners-Up, five Regional Titles and 28 Regional Runners-Up. He coached 20 State Individual Champions, 18 State Individual Runners-Up and 30 Individual Regional Champions in Girls Track and Field.

Coach Delmore was named a National High School Athletic Coaches Association Girls Assistant Coach of the Year Finalist four times, the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Subway Assistant Coach of the Year three times and was inducted into the North Dakota Track and Field Hall of Fame. Tim was named the Grand Forks Herald Local Coach of the Year three times. He has served on the Grand Forks Coaches Council for eight years.

Tim served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association by being a clinician at ten State Coaches Conventions. He was also called on to present at four National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Coaches Conventions.

Tim Delmore and his wife Marilyn have two children: Joyce and Florence.

2021 NDHSCA Hall of Fame Inductee

Dave Michaelson has been coaching for 39 years at Dickinson High School. His coaching career includes five years as a Girls Basketball Coach, 25 years as a wrestling coach, 33 years as a football coach, 32 years as a Track and Field Coach and seven years as an Assistant Athletic Director. Coach Michaelson's wrestling teams won 124 duals and 1056 multi-team victories. His track and field teams won 3920 multi-team meets. Dave's football teams won one State Championship, one Regional Title and five Regional Runners-Up. His track and field teams won five State Championships, three State Runners-Up, five Regional Titles and five Regional Runners-Up. Coach Michaelson's Wrestling Teams won three State Team Runners-Up, one State Team Dual Runners-Up, one Regional Title and five Regional Runners-Up. His Girls Basketball Teams were Regional Runners-up one time. He coached 13 State Individual Wrestling Champions, 58 State Wrestling Place Finishers, 4 Individual State Track and Field Champions in the field events, 39 State Track and Field Placers in the field events and 74 State Track and Field Qualifiers in the field events.

Coach Michaelson was named the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Subway State Wrestling Coach of the Year once and the West Region Wrestling Coach of the Year four times. He was inducted into the Dickinson State University Hall of Fame and the North Dakota Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Dave served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association as an Executive Board Member for five years acting as President in 2006-2007. He was also the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Track and Field Sport Chair for three years. He was also a member of the North Dakota High School Activities Association Official's Summit for one year.

Dave and his wife Shelly have four children: Mandy, Matt, Megan and Marc.

Lifetime Membership
