Quotes & More Quotes

A coach will impact more young people in a year than the average person does in a lifetime." This quote from Billy Graham was one of the tweets at the bottom of the NHSACA website recently. I also picked up a paper at the NHSACA Convention that was headlined by Bill Curry. It was promoting One Huddle and on it was the One Huddle Pledge. It reads... "I

am a coach. No matter my age or ability, I am a role model to many. I am an ambassador for myself, for my family and team, and for the game. I will hold myself to the highest standards and will conduct myself with integrity, with accountability, and with sportsmanship. My team has many brothers and sisters, but only One Huddle. We do not simply 'tolerate' one another – that is not enough. We love each other unconditionally, without regard to race, sex, religion, nationality, sexual orientation, or any other trait that some people would use to separate 'us' from 'them.' By my words and actions, I will do everything I can to help make our society more like my Huddle."

Coach Sue Moon, from Henderson North Carolina wrote an article in a magazine about her three C's or core values. They are commitment, character, and confidence. Within that they focus on integrity, teamwork, and responsibility. Qualities of being a good teammate and a good person. She says that the most important thing is making a connection with your players. You must connect with their heart so you can trust each other. Keeping the team's best interest at heart.

Community service is a good way to develop trust and respect because when you're giving of yourself for others, and you do it as a group, it develops that sense of team loyalty. In Kenmare, that is one of the big reasons we promote "DIG PINK" in October of every season. The kids have car washes, bake sales, and youth camps every year so they can make the contribution to a worthy cause that has affected many families. But the added benefit of working together toward this goal promotes team bonding like nothing else has. Sue maintains that when your daughter takes a jersey it's with the promise that she will sacrifice self for the team.

In that same magazine there is another article about a school in Roseburg, Oregon and they have been promoting "three values, one mission." At their volleyball games the fans would always cheer RHS during the pass, set, and spike. But now, they cheer loyalty on the pass, integrity on the set, and effort on the hit. The kids started doing this on their own because these values were being taught in all their athletic programs. I wish our school was doing that.

Another quote I came by recently from Martin Luther King Jr. says that "Intelligence plus character is the true goal of education." It is interesting how this theme of character keeps popping up everywhere. It reminded me of a coaching friend I had when I first started. Volleyball had just been sanctioned in the state and coaches were new to running tournaments. We were playing in a small North Dakota gym and each game had a time limit on it. One of the rules was that you had two timeouts. At that time there was no rule as to when the timeouts could be called. Wouldn't you know it, we wound up playing each other in the championship match. They were ahead at the end of the game. He could have called a timeout and run out the clock. He did not. My girl raced back to serve the ball and scored. The clock ran out and we played out the tiebreaker and won the tournament. His kids, my kids, and I learned more about integrity that day than any other time in my career. I recall it often and it is something I will never forget. Some of the people I have talked to since, thought he had made a coaching mistake. I even remember some of the girls saying the same thing. But was it a mistake? Would anyone even remember it if he had called a timeout.

I think he made a huge impact on all the players, parents, and coaches that day. It is an impact of integrity that I have never forgotten. I would like to think that he still is leaving an impact on kids through me today. One of the best ways to teach character is to model it!...While you're at it, go back and read the first line of this article again.

Have an impactful fall season.





The **Build Your Base** program equips athletes, coaches and parents to understand the role of beef in diet, overall health and athletic performance. The program helps student athletes and community members establish healthy habits and build life skills to prepare well-balanced, nutritious snacks and meals featuring beef.

Participating schools are eligible for grants to provide athletes with beef as a recovery protein, promotional materials, educational training videos, presentations and workshops by nutritional experts, access to the experts in the partnership, and meal planning and recipe resources.

The **Build Your Base** program prepares young athletes and their families for a successful sports season by promoting beef as a premier protein. The program supports healthy nutritional choices before, during and after a sports season through educational resources, tips and guidelines.

The North Dakota Beef Commission (NDBC), in partnership with the South Dakota Beef Industry Council (SDBIC) and Sandford Health, expanded the **Build Your Base** comprehensive sports nutrition program into North Dakota to promote beef as a premier protein for young athletes.

Beef is a natural, nutrient-rich, high-quality protein containing all the essential amino acids. A single three-ounce cooked serving of beef provides 175 calories as well as protein, iron, vitamins B12 and B6, zinc, selenium, niacin, phosphorus, riboflavin, and choline. Research has shown athletes with a consistent intake of protein throughout the day have increased rates of muscle building and muscle repair, and the ingestion of 30 grams or 4.5 ounces of protein following exercise helps maintain positive protein balance following exercise.



President Tim Wallstrum adjourned the meeting at 11:58 AM.





- Respect the integrity and judgment of the game official.
- Teach and abide by the rules of the game in letter and in spirit.
- Build and maintain ethical relationships with coaches and administrators.
- Strive for excellence in coaching skills and techniques through professional improvement.
- Promote personal fitness and good nutrition.
- Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.
- Encourage a healthy respect for the overall athletic program and its vital roles in education.
