


I believe we put our athletes and their goals at the forefront. We don't do this for us, but for them. I tell my athletes don't do this for me, do this for yourself and those around you.

The **Build Your Base** program is a comprehensive sports nutrition plan that features beef in the center of the plate. This program strives to prepare and refuel student athletes as they prepare for and compete in their sports season. The program toolkit provides resources for athletes, coaches, school health and athletic professionals, as well as parents to address nutritional needs for athletes. The program aims to support school wellness programs and build healthy communities.

The **Build Your Base** program equips athletes, coaches and parents to understand the role of beef in diet, overall health and athletic performance. The program helps student athletes and community members establish healthy habits and build life skills to prepare well-balanced, nutritious snacks and meals featuring beef.

Participating schools are eligible for grants to provide athletes with beef as a recovery protein, promotional materials, educational training videos, presentations and workshops by nutritional experts, access to the experts in the partnership, and meal planning and recipe resources.

The **Build Your Base** program prepares young athletes and their families for a successful sports season by promoting beef as a premier protein. The program supports healthy nutritional choices before, during and after a sports season through educational resources, tips and guidelines.

The North Dakota Beef Commission (NDBC), in partnership with the South Dakota Beef Industry Council (SDBIC) and Sandford Health, expanded the **Build Your Base** comprehensive sports nutrition program into North Dakota to promote beef as a premier protein for young athletes.

Beef is a natural, nutrient-rich, high-quality protein containing all the essential amino acids. A single three-ounce cooked serving of beef provides 175 calories as well as protein, iron, vitamins B12 and B6, zinc, selenium, niacin, phosphorus, riboflavin, and choline. Research has shown athletes with a consistent intake of protein throughout the day have increased rates of muscle building and muscle repair, and the ingestion of 30 grams or 4.5 ounces of protein following exercise helps maintain positive protein balance following exercise.







NDHSCA 2022 Hall of Fame Inductees

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Executive Committee voted unanimously at the Fall Meeting to induct five coaches into the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame. The inductees are as follows:

Jay Schobinger - Head Volleyball and Track and Field Coach from Dickinson High School.

Jeffrey Schumacher - Head Wrestling Coach at Bismarck High School.

Tim Wallstrum - Head Volleyball Coach at Kenmare High School.

Ron Wingenbach - Head Football and Assistant Track and Field Coach at Bismarck Century High School.



Brian Midthun coached for 38 years at North Sargent and Enderlin High School. His coaching career started in North Sargent High School at Gwinner where he was a Football and Girls Basketball Coach. In 1987 he moved to Enderlin where he coached football, baseball and served as the Athletic Director. In Coach Midthun's 38-year coaching career his baseball teams won two State Championships, 11 Regional Titles and six Regional Runners-Up. His football teams won three Regional Titles and were Conference Champions twice.

Coach Midthun was named the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Baseball Coach of the Year Finalist once, North Dakota Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Regional Athletic Director of the Year twice and the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Regional Football Coach of the Year twice. He was twice named the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Baseball Coach of

the Year and the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Regional Baseball Coach of the Year nine times.

Brain served North Dakota Coaches a number of ways. He was the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Baseball Sport Chair for three years, served on the National Federation High School Baseball Rules Committee five years, North Dakota High School Activities Association Ad-Hoc Re-Districting Committee for two years, North Dakota High School Activities Association Athletic Review for five years, North Dakota Interscholastic Athletic Administrators SE Representative for five years, North Dakota High School Coaches Association Football Advisory for three years and the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Baseball Advisory for five years. Coach Midthun also served the North Dakota High School Activities Association as the Regional Softball Chairman for six years. He was also the North Dakota High School Activities Association Regional Baseball Chairman for 11 years.

Brian and his wife Janet have two children: Abbey and Logan.



Brian served on the State advisory committee for both basketball and cross country for 4 – year terms. He also served on the NDHSCA Executive Board for 5 years and served as the State President in 1998. He has been named Class B Boys' Cross Country Coach of The Year 8 times and Class B Boys' Track Coach of The Year 2 times. He also has been named the NHSACA National Coach of The Year in boys' cross country. He was also named the Class A Boys' Golf Coach of The Year. In 1991 he was named by the North Dakota Sportswriters and Sportcasters Male High School Coach of The Year.

Fargo North High School Cross Country Coach



Rodney Hardie grew up on a farm and ranch near Redfield, South Dakota. He graduated from Redfield High School in 1972. While in high school, Rodney competed in football and track and field. He was also active in service clubs and church as a high school student.

Rodney went on to graduate from University of Jamestown during the spring of 1976 with a Bachelor of Science degrees in Elementary and Physical Education. During his collegiate years, he competed in track and field for four years and cross country for three years. Rodney was a student assistant in cross country during his senior year at the University of Jamestown. Rodney received his Master of Science Degree from the Tri College University-Fargo in Educational Administration.

Rodney began his career at Hazelton, North Dakota in 1976. He taught at the middle school and coached boys' and girls' basketball and track and field. The following year he transferred to Kenmare, North Dakota and taught 5th and 6th grade math and English and coached boys and girls basketball and track and field. She attended the University of Oregon and became a numerous All-American Track and Field athlete. The following fall, he returned to Fargo North to assistant in both the track and field and cross country teams for several years.

Rodney was named NDHSCA State Boys' Cross Country Coach of the Year three times and was a NHSACA National Boys' Cross Country Coach of the Year finalist three times. He was a NHSACA finalist in both track and field and cross country. He served as the Class A representative for the cross country advisory committee from 1998-2004. He served on the NDHSCA Executive Committee as an assistant executive secretary for 7 years from 1998 to 2005. Rodney served the North Dakota Coaches Association as membership and convention registration chair for 13 years. He was awarded the NHSACA Distinguished Service Award in 2020.

The **Build Your Base** program is a comprehensive sports nutrition plan that features beef in the center of the plate. This program strives to prepare and refuel student athletes as they prepare for and compete in their sports season. The program toolkit provides resources for athletes, coaches, school health and athletic professionals, as well as parents to address nutritional needs for athletes. The program aims to support school wellness programs and build healthy communities.

The **Build Your Base** program equips athletes, coaches and parents to understand the role of beef in diet, overall health and athletic performance. The program helps student athletes and community members establish healthy habits and build life skills to prepare well-balanced, nutritious snacks and meals featuring beef.

Participating schools are eligible for grants to provide athletes with beef as a recovery protein, promotional materials, educational training videos, presentations and workshops by nutritional experts, access to the experts in the partnership, and meal planning and recipe resources.

The **Build Your Base** program prepares young athletes and their families for a successful sports season by promoting beef as a premier protein. The program supports healthy nutritional choices before, during and after a sports season through educational resources, tips and guidelines.

The North Dakota Beef Commission (NDBC), in partnership with the South Dakota Beef Industry Council (SDBIC) and Sandford Health, expanded the **Build Your Base** comprehensive sports nutrition program into North Dakota to promote beef as a premier protein for young athletes.

Beef is a natural, nutrient-rich, high-quality protein containing all the essential amino acids. A single three-ounce cooked serving of beef provides 175 calories as well as protein, iron, vitamins B12 and B6, zinc, selenium, niacin, phosphorus, riboflavin, and choline. Research has shown athletes with a consistent intake of protein throughout the day have increased rates of muscle building and muscle repair, and the ingestion of 30 grams or 4.5 ounces of protein following exercise helps maintain positive protein balance following exercise.





Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership
