- Encourage the highest standards of conduct and scholastic achievement among all athletes.
- Seek to inculcate good health habits including the establishment of sound training rules.
- Strive to develop in each athlete the qualities of leadership, initiative and good judgement.
- For Interscholastic competition, will dress in an appropriate manner that distinguishes the coach as a professional, representing his school and team.

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Summer Coaches Convention will be held in Mandan at the Baymont (2611 Old Red Trail) from Monday, July 25th through Thursday, July 28th. Rooms have been set aside for this convention at the Baymont.

Registration for the convention is open online at www.ndhsca.com

We will send an e-mail out letting people know when it is open. All coaches will need to register through the NDHSCA website: www.ndhsca.com. Here are some key points about this summer's convention.

- 1. **NDHSCA Membership is \$60.00 and Convention registration is \$65.00.** One needs to be a member to attend the convention.
- 2. The Convention will be held at the Baymont in Mandan.
- 3. Dates of the convention are July 25th through July 28th.
- 4. Up to two semester hours of credit available through NDSU.
 - a. Cost is \$65.00 per credit
 - b. A person may take one or two credits

- 7. **Social** will be <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 27th</u> with a free taco feed and games.



In early April, the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Executive Office was notified that Collette Folstad from West Fargo, ND will be a recipient of the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Kathy Holloway Women of Inspiration Award. Congratulations Collette! This is a great honor for Coach Folstad and also for North Dakota. Collette

was a trailblazer and leader in North Dakota for girls' and women's sports. She represents everything and the personal traits of the individual the award is named after, Kathy Holloway from Louisiana.

In 1973 the women coaches in North Dakota had a meeting in one room while the men met in another room. The ladies talked about starting a Women's Coaching Association. Collette disagreed with starting their own organization. She felt the women should approach the men on becoming part of the North Dakota High School Coaches Association. Obviously, the ladies asked Collette if she was going to be the one to take on the mission. Collette said "yes." She saw Gelaine Orvik and asked him about having women join the NDHSCA. Gelaine told Collette she needed to come to their board meeting and present the information in front of the board. Coach Folstad did, and the rest is history. Basically, Collette Folstad is the first women to join the NDHSCA and with her leadership, ladies throughout the state became members. She is truly a pathfinder.

Collette has been inducted into the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the North Dakota State University Hall of Fame, the Concordia College Moorhead Athletic Hall of Fame and the West Fargo High School Girls' Basketball Teams are in the school's Hall of Fame. Two of her West Fargo High School Girls' Basketball Teams are in the school's Hall of Fame. She was also inducted into the North Dakota Amateur Softball Hall of Fame and the Fargo-Moorhead Softball Hall of Fame. Collette was a NHSACA Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year Finalist four times, a NDHSCA Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year two times, a NDHSCA East Region Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year three times and was the North Dakota Sportscasters and Sportswriters Special Achievement Award recipient once. She was a NHSACA Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year finalist twice and a NHSACA Girls' Sports Coach of the Year Finalist twice.

Coach Folstad's girls' basketball teams won two state championships and were state runners-up twice. Her teams won the Region Championship twice and were regional runners-up four times. Collette coached her girls' basketball teams to four conference titles. Her combined high school and college basketball coaching record was 477-288.

Collette served as chairperson for the NDHSAA Ad-Hoc committee to re-write the by-laws for girls' sports. She served on the NDHSCA Advisory Committee for girls' basketball. Coach Folstad also served as a committee member for the North Dakota High School Coaches Association when they hosted the 1991 National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Convention in Bismarck. She also served as a committee member to establish the North Dakota High School Athletic Association calendar.

- Display leadership qualities during the season of nomination.
- Display commendable citizenship and have no NDHSAA Training Rule Violations during academic year.
- Have never been suspended from respective athletic team or the school of representation during academic year.

Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member one must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
- A Lifetime Member relinquishes voting and office holding privileges if a member is no longer an active coach. If they are active in coaching, voting and office holding privileges continue.
