Changes and Constants

Greetings to all. I hope by the time you read this our seemingly never-ending winter will **finally** be coming to a close.

I would like to congratulate all the teams, athletes, and coaches on a great winter season. A special shout out to all the state champion teams and individual champions, the championship coaches, the NDHSCA POWERade Senior Athlete recipients, and the NDHSCA Subway Coach of the Year recipients.

The spring season is now upon us, and the excitement that comes with a new season never seems to get old, unlike me who is getting old, or should I use the term more *experienced*.

Having been in coaching for nearly half a century, I have experienced much. I am going to relate some of my observations and experiences over that time span. Some changes that have occurred and some of the constants.

Let me start with one of the most recent changes, going from two to three classes in basketball. The big change will begin next season. It seemed like the change came rather quickly and suddenly, but it has actually been discussed for years. Most changes seem to evolve but when the change is announced it seems like it was a fast decision.

Some of the changes that have occurred since I began my career include adding many women's sports. Girls' wrestling may be the most recent. Girls' hockey, volleyball, boys' and girls' soccer to name a few have also been added. Football has also changed with classifications over that time. I have seen the growth of cross country over the years. I remember when we switched from the English system to using the metric system in track.

Another significant change was when the NDHSCA started the NDHSCA/POWERade Outstanding Senior Athlete award. This is an award that is appreciated by the recipients. Being a member of the NDHSCA board I have been fortunate to be able to present these awards at various state tournaments and events over the years, so I get to see the joy of those who receive this award. The NDHSCA/Subway Coach of the Year in each sport is also well deserved and appreciated by the recipients. Presenting these awards has given me the opportunity to see first-hand some of the state tournaments that I might not otherwise have attended. It has been eye opening and enjoyable for me to visit these events.

One constant I have found to remain over the years is building a trusting relationship with my students and athletes. There have been many changes over time. As an example, when I started coaching most of my kids were farm kids. Now we don't have many farm kids, but they all have the will to get better and that is our constant. We all still try to improve as much as we can, trying to overcome whatever obstacles may get in our way.

The biggest constant for me has been the NDHSCA summer coaching clinic. That is where I could keep up with the changes that were occurring and how to best deal with those changes. The sharing by all the coaches is such a great thing and really promotes all sports in North Dakota. When I started, coaches seemed to be more secretive about what we did. But as I went to more clinics and witnessed more sharing, I found we kept getting better and better through sharing. As a result, coaching clinics have had a profound effect on what I do as a coach and have helped me grow over time. So please attend if you are able or be a presenter to share with others your experience.



2023 Coaches Convention Planned

The North Dakota High School Coaches Association Summer Coaches Convention will be held in Fargo at the Ramada Hotel and Conference Center (3333 – 13th Avenue South) from Monday, July 17th through Thursday, July 20th. Rooms have been reserved for this convention at the Ramada. Please call to reserve today (701-235-3333).

Registration for the convention should be open around May 5th. We will send an e-mail out letting people know when it is open. All coaches will need to register through the NDHSCA website: www.ndhsca.com. Here are some key points about this summer's convention.

- 1. Convention registration is \$65.00. Membership remains at \$60.00. Need to be a member to attend the convention.
- 2. Convention is held at the Ramada in Fargo.
- 3. Dates of the convention are July 17th through July 20th.
- 4. Up to two semester hours of credit available through NDSU
 - a. Cost is \$65.00 per credit
 - b. A person may take one or two credits
 - c. Website has the criteria for the syllabus to earn the credits
 - d. Final registration for credit will be at the hotel
- 5. May recertify in CPR/AED/First Aid This will only be available on Monday, July 17th. only. Cost will be \$15.00 to recertify
- 6. May recertify in Concussion Management. There is only one session and it will be on Monday, July 17th.
- 7. Social will be Wednesday, July 19th with a free taco feed and games
- 8. NDHSCA Annual Meeting will take place on Thursday, July 20th. There will be a Subway Lunch for all meeting attendees.
- 9. NDHSCA Hall of Fame/Coach of the Year Banquet will be Thursday, July 20th.
- 10. Great sessions all week.

All Athletic Directors and coaches are reminded this will work for the recertification process of coaches. We have worked hard to bring a number of different coaches to the convention this summer.
