Trust Leads To Confidence

Kudos to all the teams and athletes for a great spring season.

Congratulations to all the individual and team champions this spring, and to all the Outstanding Senior Athlete winners and the spring Coach of the Year recipients.

The performances were quite amazing considering the weather. I believe this is a direct result of the quality of coaches and coaching that takes place here in North Dakota. It never ceases to amaze me what the coaches of our state do for our kids.

As I was contemplating what to write about, I asked several colleagues if there was anything they would like me to write about. One suggestion was how do you teach self-confidence. I will attempt to touch on that topic with a track and cross-country perspective.

I am not sure if I teach self-confidence, but rather try to instill in an athlete to believe and trust in themselves. I believe a coach must also have self-confidence.

The first thing I do with the kids is to let them know that it is okay to be nervous and anxious about new things. It is also okay to try things and you are going to make mistakes. I let them know that whatever we are doing is based on what I think will work best and what is best suited for the athletes, but that doesn't mean it will always work that way. I want to let them know that I make mistakes as well. I explain to the kids what we are trying to accomplish with each workout, whether it is an easy day or hard day, and that nobody is being punished, even though it may feel like that during a workout.

The main goal is to get everyone to see their worth to the team and to their teammates. I put a lot of trust in each athlete and if possible, see if they can share with a teammate. I will continually monitor the kids to see how they are feeling or if we must back off for some individuals. I ask them how much more do you think you can do? I also have them tell me what their bodies are experiencing so I can get feedback from them. I tell them I can't feel any of their pain, so they must let me know how they are feeling. We end each practice with a fist bump so I must see each athlete personally before they can leave. It is kind of funny because if I get busy with some individuals or another group, they will seek me out to get their "fist bump" before leaving practice.

So how do I maintain my own self-confidence? First, I continually question myself about if this is the best way to get the job done or is there a better or at least more efficient way to do this. For me I get the most feedback by talking to other coaches personally. One can learn plenty online or in other ways. But for me, having face to face meetings are the best. Attending the NDHSCA state coach's clinic is a great place to share your ideas and to get ideas from other coaches. This has been an invaluable source of self-confidence for me. It may be getting

something that is adaptable to the kids you have, something new that you can try or just reaffirming that what you are doing is working. So, I encourage each of you to attend the NDHSCA coaching clinic in Fargo, July 17th – July 20th.

Every coach has their own way of instilling self-confidence in their athletes, and it was on full display at the recently completed State Track and Field meet. There are infinite ways to accomplish what we do, which is what makes coaching so great.

The best of luck to all, hope to see you at the State Coaches Convention and keep up the great work you are doing.



Coach Christensen has been coaching for 15 years. He is responsible for coaching all girls' and boys' pole vaulters from Junior High to Varsity in the West Fargo Sheyenne school system. **Adam** also administers the pole vault event at all the home track and field meets and assists in facilitating the event at away meets. He coached both the Girls' and Boys' State Pole Vault Champions in 2022. In the past seven years **Adam** has had a steady stream of State Qualifiers in the Pole Vault. He loves to see athletes improve throughout the year and be able to make starting heights for the first time.

The annual NDHSCA-Gelaine Orvik \$1,000 Scholarship recipients have been selected and notified. The presentations will be made at the Annual NDHSCA Coaches Awards Ceremony to be held at the Fargo Ramada Inn on Thursday, July 20th. The selection committee evaluate and assess applicants before determining the beneficiaries. After careful consideration of all the criteria, the recipients will be **Bryce Philpot** from Grand Forks Central High School and **Amya Gourneau** from Turtle Mountain Community High School.

The Scholarship was established in 2008 when the Late Joe Howell, Lisbon High School Track & Field Coach made a motion to establish the scholarship to honor Gelaine Orvik. Coach Orvik is a 35-year veteran coach who also served the North Dakota High School Coaches Association from 1974-2015. The requirements for the Scholarship Recipient are that he or she will be a student-athlete graduate from a North Dakota High School and will attend a North Dakota College or University. The final requisite is that he/she intends to pursue the profession of interscholastic coaching.

The nomination form identifies the criteria used for selection consideration: GPA, class rank percentile, athletic awards, activity awards, ACT test scores, captains' and leadership roles, a personal application letter, and recommendation letters from faculty, coach and administration. The recipients also best exemplify the values and ideals modeled by Coach Orvik, as teacher and coach; those values, ideals and principles he expected from his athletes and students; those same values, ideals and principles he urges all coaches to portray.

Bryce Philpot



Bryce is ranked first in his class of 218 at Grand Forks Central High School. He will have earned 26.0 credits when he graduates; he earned a 4.00 GPA (4.333 Weighted GPA) through seven semesters. Bryce has earned credits in Advanced and Enriched classes that includes Advanced Placement Calculus, DC English, Advanced Placement Biology, DC Speech, Enriched Pre-Calculus, Enriched Algebra II, Enriched Chemistry, and Enriched Geometry. Bryce knows understands that coaching is more than the competition.

Bryce identifies successful coaches really care about their athletes and those athletes trust their coaches. This relationship is built off trust and from that trust other factors that make teams successful are developed: those factors of accountability, respectfulness, responsibility, coachability and safety. He continues with ". . . being coachable is not a one-way street."

Bryce notes that besides his parents, his coaches have had the strongest influence on his life. This fact has become his motivation as a way to give back to those who have influenced him. High school coaches are probably the major influence on teenagers' lives and those young people probably have not had a good role model.

Bryce had three outstanding people praise him as "an excellent young man with a very bright future." One letter of recommendation notes that "Whether on the field, ice, or classroom, Bryce is a leader and does the right things."

Bryce is praised by his football coach for being "... a relentless competitor with unmatched practice habits." His coach points out that "Bryce has a willingness to do whatever it takes to put the team first." Finally, he adds that "Bryce has a remarkable respect towards opponents, officials, and the game itself." In addition, "Bryce is extremely likeable and polite. He is quick to greet people with a smile and has an uncanny organizational skill to gather all teammates together to enhance a powerful bonding experience."



- For interscholastic competition, will dress in an appropriate manner that distinguishes the coach as a professional, representing his school and team.
