The convention will conclude on Thursday, July 20th with the NDHSCA Annual Meeting and the NDHSCA Hall of Fame/Coach of the Year Banquet.



The NDHSCA Executive Board has decided to continue to offer two \$100.00 Scheels Gift Cards. One will be drawn amongst coaches who are attending the convention their first or second time and one will be open to all coaches who have attended for three or more years. The North Dakota High School Coaches Association has made nominations for balloting for the Association's Vice President. The balloting will be conducted at the North Dakota High School Coaches Association State Coaches Convention held this summer at the Fargo Ramada July 17 through July 20.

The two candidates will be Greg Brown, currently the Head Girls' Track and Field Coach at Mandan High School and Mike Hendrickson, Head Boys' Basketball Coach at Fargo South High School.



Greg Brown is a graduate of the University of Mary. He is a 27-year coaching veteran. He is currently the Head Girls' Track and Field Coach at Mandan High School. He has held this position for four years. Previously Greg coached Boys' and Girls' Cross Country and Girls' Track and Field at Watford City High School. He has also coached Boys' and Girls' Basketball, Football, Wrestling and Girls' Swimming. He coached the 2009 Watford City Girls' Cross Country Team to a State Championship. Greg was named the NDHSCA State Girls' Cross Country Coach of the Year twice and the NDHSCA State Girls' Track and Field Coach of the Year once. He has served the National High School Athletic Coaches Association as the Girls' Track and Field Sports Chair for six years, the North Dakota High School Coaches Association Girls' Track and Field Advisory for eight years and one year on the Class A Girls' Cross Country Advisory. Coach Brown has been a clinician multiple NDHSCA State Coaches Conventions.

Greg and his wife Kelly have two children: Chans and Reid.

Mike Hendrickson is a graduate of Minot State University and St. Catherine University. He is a 32-year coaching veteran. Mike is the Head Boys' Basketball Coach at Fargo South High School. He has also coached Girls Basketball, Baseball and Track and Field. His career coaching record in boys' basketball is 480 wins with 315 losses and girls' basketball was 30 wins with 30 losses. Coach Hendrickson has coached three State Class A Boys' Basketball Runnerup teams. He was the National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Coach of the Year Finalist in Boys Basketball once. Coach Hendrickson was the NDHSCA State Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year once and the NDHSCA Regional Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year three times. He has served the NDHSCA on Bovs Basketball Advisory for three years and been a Lion's All-Star Basketball Co-Chairperson for 21 vears. Mike received the Lion's Melvin Jones Award in 2019.

Lifetime Membership

To purchase a Lifetime Membership the prospective coach must have been:

- A North Dakota High School Coaches Association Member for 20 years
- An active high school coach for at least 25 years either in North Dakota or another state

Notes on Lifetime Membership

- Lifetime Membership may be purchased for a one-time fee of \$300. In order to become a Lifetime Member one must be a member which is \$60. The lifetime Membership fee would be \$360 total.
- Lifetime Membership will carry all Active Membership benefits including \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance coverage
